Pastures have been better than anyone can ever remember for this time of year, which has allowed farmers a bit more time to think about rather than actually have to feed hay. A hard freeze is predicted as the weekend approaches which will stop any further growth this year. The hay supply remains the same as weeks past, heavy on average to lower quality and the high quality hay supply for mostly horse and dairies gets smaller with each day.
