The cooler than normal temperatures are also a big relief to those scattered areas that haven't been lucky enough to get moisture all summer, keeping grass in those areas from totally burning up. As normal conditions vary across the state but overall the state is in much better condition that one expects for the mid-point of August. Hay movement remains slow, most producers just not able to move any stunning amounts of hay although prices remain steady to firm; supply moderate to heavy and demand is light to moderate.
