Missouri Weekly Hay Summary

A week of rain free weather has resulted in many gallons of burnt diesel fuel. Many farmers especially in the southern 2/3rds of the state have spent days in the hay field. Regardless of which side of the market one is on there is still uncertainty of what the year will bring for hay prices. Milk prices are near 50% of last years highs making that 1.00 plus per RFV point out of reach for dairies. The large carryover of fair quality round bales is likely to add more pressure come feeding season to the beef sector if any amount of hay is baled this year. Hay demand is light, supply moderate to steady and prices steady to weak. Spring tillage is 61 percent complete, 22 days behind the normal of 82 percent. There were 1.9 days suitable for fieldwork with the north-west district reporting over 3 days suitable. **Field Crops Report** Corn planting is 54 percent complete, a 15 point increase from last week. Planting is 21 days behind the normal pace of 84 percent complete. Corn emergence is at 35 percent, a 14 point increase from last week but 17 days behind normal. Soybean planting is 9 percent complete, 14 days behind the normal pace of 33 percent. Sorghum planting is at 9 percent, 24 days behind normal. Wheat heading is at 70 percent, 4 days behind the normal of 80 percent. Heading is nearly complete in the southeast and south-central districts. Condition is rated 1 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 35 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 9 percent excellent. Wheat is 57 percent in good to excellent condition compared to the normal of 45 percent. The first cutting of alfalfa is 7 percent complete, 10 days behind the normal of 11 percent. Other hay is 2 percent cut, on par with last year. Pasture & Livestock Pasture condition is rated 3 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 11 percent excellent, a 4 point increase in good to excellent from last week.
