**Missouri Fescue Seed Report**

Buying stations started seeing trucks arrive last weekend and the beginning of this week, however fescue season is ending almost as fast as it started for many. The crop matured very quickly and moisture for seed coming in is typically 15-20% where as most years when the first trucks arrive its high 20's to low 30's. Several buying stations already talking of closing shop for the year either because they are already full due to large amounts of carry over, or else because the seed just isn't coming in. Most producers are reporting they are covering lots of ground to fill the trucks as seed yield is just not there this year. For all practical purposes cutting season will be complete by mid next week. Prices in all areas of the state are steady. (Dry: Moisture 12-14% - Wet: Moisture greater than 14%) (Prices per lb.) All Regions: .18 wet, .20 dry.

**moisture** is 2 percent short, 61 percent adequate, and 37 percent surplus. **Spring tillage** is 96 percent complete. There were 2.6 **days suitable for fieldwork.** **Field Crops Report** **Corn** emergence is at 97 percent, on par with normal. Normally corn is about 10 percent silked but this year it is just beginning in the southeast, south-central, east-central and north-central districts. Corn condition is rated 3 percent very poor, 9 percent poor, 39 percent fair, 42 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. The east-central and northwest districts showed a 21 and 13 point drop in good to excellent condition last week. **Soybean** planting is 75 percent complete, 14 days behind the normal pace of 88 percent. Planting of double cropped soybeans has begun. Emergence is 65 percent, 10 days behind a normal of 80 percent. Soybean condition is 2 percent very poor, 9 percent poor, 39 percent fair, 45 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. **Sorghum** planting is at 77 percent, 16 days behind the normal of 89 percent. Sorghum condition is rated 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 53 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. **Wheat** turning color is 95 percent complete, 5 days behind the normal of 99 percent. The wheat harvest is 23 percent complete, 5 days behind the normal of 42 percent. Drier weather in the southeast district allowed for a 46 point increase in wheat harvested. Condition is rated 2 percent very poor, 13 percent poor, 41 percent fair, 36 percent good, and 8 percent excellent. Scattered areas of disease have been reported across the State. The first cutting of **alfalfa** is 80 percent complete, 10 days behind the normal of 91 percent. **Other hay** is 50 percent cut, 9 days behind the normal of 64 percent. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** condition is rated 2 percent poor, 24 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 17 percent excellent.
