Statewide, **topsoil moisture** is rated 1 percent very short, 18 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. There were 6.3 **days suitable for fieldwork. Field Crops Report** Ninety-six percent of the **corn** is in the dough stage or beyond, 3 days ahead of last year but 12 days behind normal. Corn dent is 85 percent complete, 4 days ahead of last year but 11 days behind the normal of 94 percent. Thirty-four percent of the corn is mature, 3 days ahead of last year but 18 days behind a normal of 70 percent. Corn harvested is 7 percent complete, 4 days ahead of last year but 15 days behind normal of 27 percent. Corn condition is rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 27 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 17 percent excellent. Ninety-four percent of **soybeans** are setting pods, 8 days ahead of last year but 8 days behind normal. Soybeans turning color is 25 percent, 3 days ahead of last year but 8 days behind the normal of 47 percent. Eight percent of soybeans are dropping leaves, 4 days ahead of last year but 7 days behind normal. Soybean condition is rated 3 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 15 percent excellent. **Sorghum** heading is 96 percent. Sorghum turning color is 63 percent complete, 2 days ahead of last year but 13 days behind normal. Sorghum mature is at 21 percent, same as last year but 11 days behind normal. The sorghum harvested is 1 percent complete. Sorghum condition is rated 4 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 10 percent excellent. **Winter wheat** seeding has begun. The third cutting of **alfalfa** is 93 percent complete, 12 days ahead of last year and 3 days ahead of normal.
