**Crop Progress and Condition 05/09/10 Agricultural Summary**

Rainfall at the end of the previous week slowed fieldwork before drier conditions allowed farmers to resume progress. **Topsoil moisture** was rated 4 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 25 percent surplus. There were 3.8 days suitable for fieldwork. Spring tillage advanced to 79 percent complete, 17 days ahead of last year's 54 percent and 10 days ahead of the 5-year average of 68 percent complete. **Field Crops Report Corn** planting averaged 84 percent complete, up 9 points from last week. This is 17 days ahead of last year's 38 percent and almost 13 days ahead of the normal of 63 percent complete. The southern third of the state has nearly completed planting; however, some of this corn will need to be replanted. The north-west and north-central districts each averaged only 74 percent complete. Corn emerged was 53 percent, 15 days ahead of last year and 5 days ahead of normal. Corn condition was rated 3 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 34 percent fair, 48 percent good, and 8 percent excellent. **Soybean** planting averaged 14 percent complete, 10 days ahead of last year's 5 percent and just over a day ahead of normal. The southeast district averaged 29 percent complete. The soybean crop is just beginning to emerge, averaging 3 percent across the State. Wheat condition was rated 8 percent very poor, 20 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 29 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. First cutting of **alfalfa** was 5 percent complete, 6 days ahead of last year, but 4 days behind normal.
