Crop Progress and Condition 05/09/10 Agricultural Summary

Heavy rainfall limited fieldwork over the State except for the Bootheel. Producers are concerned with the potential need to replant corn due to the continued cool, damp conditions. **Topsoil moisture** was rated 38 percent adequate and 62 percent surplus, comparable with a year ago. **Spring tillage** reached 80 percent complete, 11 days ahead of last year's 60 percent and 4 days ahead of the 5-year average of 75 percent complete. **Field Crops Report:** Corn planting averaged 85 percent complete, up one point from last week. This is 11 days ahead of last year's 52 percent and nearly 7 days ahead of the normal of 73 percent complete. Corn condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 13 percent poor, 33 percent fair, 42 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. **Soybean** planting averaged 18 percent complete, 4 days ahead of last year's 8 percent, but 3 days behind normal. The soybean crop was 7 percent emerged throughout the State, 8 days ahead of last year, but similar to normal. **Winter wheat** averaged 64 percent headed, This is similar to last year, but almost 3 days behind normal. Wheat condition was rated 9 percent very poor, 22 percent poor, 35 percent fair, 29 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. First cutting of **alfalfa** was 8 percent complete, a day ahead of last year, but 7 days behind normal. **Other hay** was 3 percent cut, 2 days ahead of last year, but 3 days behind normal.
