**Missouri Fescue Seed Report**

Week ending 06/24/10 Fescue season is everything but done throughout the state now. Most stations have closed and are in the process of taking inventory and cleaning up. Although no record harvest was expected or wanted from the buyers side. Many expressed some disappointment in the amount of seed that was bought as several areas saw loss from wind and rain storms this year, and also many reports of areas were few combines even fired up this year. Prices are reported as steady with last week. Next week will be the final report of this season although no one officially tracks harvest we will try to get a good estimate on final harvest inventory for the season. Southwest, Northeast, Central, South Central, Northwest, and Southeast: .18 wet, .20 dry. **Crop Progress and Condition 06/27/10** Dry conditions this week have allowed many farmers in the northern third of the State back into their fields. Although these hot, dry conditions are good for fieldwork, some areas of the State are experiencing yield losses, pollination problems, and crop deterioration. **Field Crops Report:** Corn silked and beyond was 20 percent complete, 5 days ahead of last year, but similar to the 5-year average (normal). Corn condition was rated 7 percent very poor, 15 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 36 percent good, and 10 percent excellent, slightly worse than a week earlier. **Soybean** planting was reported as 90 percent complete, a day ahead of last year's 88 percent, but a day behind the normal of 91 percent. Seventy-eight percent of the soybean acreage has emerged, 2 days ahead of last year, but 5 days behind normal. **Sorghum** planting was 92 percent complete, similar to both last year and normal. Sorghum headed and beyond was 3 percent complete, 12 days ahead of last year, but similar to normal. **Winter wheat** harvest was 64 percent complete, slightly ahead of normal. The quality of the harvested wheat in the northern third of the State is reported as very poor due to 4 consecutive weeks of wet conditions. Wheat condition was rated 10 percent very poor, 20 percent poor, 35 percent fair, 31 percent good, and 4 percent excellent. First cutting of **alfalfa** was 80 percent complete, 6 days behind last year and 14 days behind normal. The second cutting of alfalfa is 32 percent complete. **Other hay** was 64 percent cut.
