Missouri Weekly Hay Summary- Week ending 09/17/10

Fall pastures have kicked in gear and begun to spring up in areas of the state that have had ample moisture. Pasture conditions statewide improved significantly over the past week in several areas. The south central and southeast, however once again left out. Pasture conditions in those two areas is depressing to say the least, and with growing days ticking away it is starting to seem very unlikely pastures will recover this year, let alone allow for any stock piling of pastures before winter. Meanwhile many farmers to the north are once again looking at fields with standing water. Corn harvest has basically come to a standstill for most and several farmers once again trading the tires for tracks in hopes of making the combine float and not sink. The supply of hay is moderate, demand light to moderate, and prices steady. Crop Progress and Condition 09/19/10 Topsoil moisture supplies were rated 3 percent very short, 8 percent short, 64 percent adequate, and 25 percent surplus. On -farm storage availability for this year's harvest is rated 16 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus, virtually unchanged from a week earlier. Field Crops Report The corn crop was 97 percent dented, 19 days ahead of last year and 4 days ahead of the 5-year average (normal). Thirty-four percent of the corn has been harvested, 20 days ahead of last vear and just ahead of normal. The Bootheel reported 87 percent of the corn has been harvested. Corn condition was rated 6 percent very poor, 16 percent poor, 29 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 9 percent excellent, slightly better than a week earlier. Respondents are reporting **corn mois**ture at harvest between 14.7 percent and 18.3 percent with a State average of 17.4 percent, down from last week's 18.7 percent. Soybeans turning color was 57 percent complete, over 3 days ahead of last year but slightly behind normal. Soybean harvest has just begun with 1 percent complete. Soybean condition was rated 5 percent very poor, 13 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 40 percent good, and 11 percent excellent, slightly improved from last week.
