**Week Ending August 28, 2011 Agricultural Summary** Dry conditions in the central district reduced crop conditions and hampered pasture growth. There were 6.5 **days suitable for fieldwork** statewide. **Topsoil moisture** decreased from last week's reprieve resting at 27 percent very short, 38 percent short, 33 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. The northwest district fared best with topsoil rated 65 percent adequate. Lack of moisture was a concern for the northeast district with topsoil moisture rated 99 percent short and very short, and the southwest district at 98 percent short and very short. **Field Crops Report Corn** dough stage and beyond was 95 percent, 5 days ahead of last year and the 5-year historic average (normal). Corn dented was 84 percent, 6 days ahead of last year, and 8 days ahead of normal. Corn mature was 33 percent, 1 day ahead of last year, and 2 days ahead of normal. The top 3 districts for corn dented were southwest, 98 percent, central, 95 percent, and southeast, 96 percent, but the top 3 districts for corn mature were southwest, 90 percent, central, 50 percent, and the west-central at 58 percent. Corn harvested was 6 percent, 1 day behind last year, but 1 day ahead of normal. Corn condition was 21 percent very poor, 23 percent poor, 26 percent fair, 26 percent good, and 4 percent excellent. **Soybeans** blooming and beyond were 97 percent, 2 days ahead of last year, and 3 days ahead of normal. Soybeans setting pods and beyond were 84 percent, the same as last year, but 2 days ahead of normal. Soybeans turning color and beyond were 3 percent, 4 days behind last year, and 5 days behind normal. Soybeans in the northeast and east-central districts began to drop leaves. Soybean condition rated 13 percent very poor, 17 percent poor, 31 percent fair, 31 percent good, and 8 percent excellent. **Sorghum** headed and beyond was 93 percent, 2 days behind last year, but 3 days ahead of normal. Sorghum turning color and beyond was 40 percent, 10 days behind last year, and 1 week behind normal. Sorghum mature was 9 percent, 4 days behind last year, and 2 days behind normal. Sorghum condition was 2 percent very poor, 27 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 33 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. **Alfalfa hay** 3rd cutting was 88 percent, 3 days ahead of last year, and 8 days behind normal. **Pasture & Livestock Pasture** condition decreased slightly from last week to 18 percent very poor, 26 percent poor, 37 percent fair, 17 percent good, and 2 percent excellent. Some producers continued to feed hay.
