Crop Progress and Condition Week Ending August 4, 2013

Agricultural Summary Cool temperatures with heavy rainfall in the southwest part of the state and widespread showers across the rest of the state improved crop conditions. There were 4.6 days **suitable for field-work**. The southwest district had 2.2 days suitable for fieldwork. **Topsoil moisture** supply was 10 percent very short, 27 percent short, 54 percent adequate and 9 percent surplus. **Subsoil moisture supply** was 6 percent very short, 28 percent short, 62 percent adequate and 4 percent surplus. **Field Crops Report** **Corn** silked was 89 percent complete, 19 days behind last year and 5 days behind normal (5-year average). Forty-two percent of corn was in the dough stage, 20 days behind last year and 6 days behind normal. Corn dented was 10 percent complete, 21 days behind last year and 8 days behind normal. Corn condition was 5 percent very poor, 15 percent poor, 30 percent fair, 43 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. **Soybeans** blooming were 53 percent complete, 16 days behind last year and 7 days behind normal. Soybeans setting pods was 16 percent complete, 13 days behind last year and 8 days behind normal. Soybean condition was 4 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 34 percent fair, 44 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. **Sorghum** headed was 43 percent complete, 16 days behind last year and 5 days behind normal. One percent of sorghum was turning color and beyond, 28 days behind last year and 20 days behind normal. Sorghum condition was 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 54 percent good, and 3 percent excellent. **Alfalfa hay** 2nd cutting was 96 percent, 22 days behind last year but 6 days ahead of normal. Alfalfa hay 3rd cutting was 26 percent, 20 days behind last year and 5 days behind normal. Other hay cut was 95 percent, 30 days behind last year, but 3 days ahead of normal. **Pasture & Livestock** **Pasture** conditions were 2 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 36 percent fair, 49 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. **Supply of hay and other roughages** was 1 percent very short, 5 percent short, 83 percent adequate and 11 percent surplus. **Stock water supplies** were 5 percent short, 85 percent adequate and 10 percent surplus. **Weather Summary** **Temperatures** were 3 to 8 degrees below average across the state. **Precipitation** averaged 1.92 inches statewide. The southwest district reported 5.10 inches. Wright County reported 10.26 inches
