Missouri Crop Progress and Condition Report
05/18/2014

Frost was reported in some northern counties during the week ending May 18, with statewide temperatures averaging 9.0 degrees below normal. There were 3.5 days suitable for fieldwork. Precipitation averaged 1.20 inches statewide, providing much needed moisture for the state. Corn planting progressed to 92 percent complete, up 28 percentage points from last year and up 15 percentage points the 5-year average. Corn emerged progressed to 72 percent which is 18 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 26 percent short, 65 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 10 percent very short, 35 percent short, 54 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Winter wheat progressed to 67 percent headed. Winter wheat condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 9 percent poor, 38 percent fair, 46 percent good, and 6 percent excellent. Soybean planting progressed to 32 percent complete, 21 percentage points ahead of last year and 7 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Rice planting progressed to 86 percent complete. Rice emerged progressed to 71 percent. Cotton planting progressed to 62 percent complete. Pasture condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 12 percent poor, 50 percent fair, 33 percent good, and 3 percent excellent.
