Missouri Crop Progress and Condition

Minimal precipitation fell across Missouri allowing row crop harvest to continue. There were 6.2 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending September 20. Temperatures averaged 69.6 degrees, 2.7 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.25 inches statewide, 0.73 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent very short, 27 percent short, 63 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 18 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. Corn dented reached 97 percent, 1 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn mature reached 70 percent, 9 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Corn harvest was 27 percent complete, 9 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Soybeans setting pods reached 95 percent. Soybeans dropping leaves progressed to 17 percent, 8 percentage points behind last year and 10 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Sorghum harvest was 10 percent complete, 2 percentage point behind the 5-year average. Cotton bolls opening progressed to 60 percent, 1 percentage point above the 5-year average. Rice harvested was 20 percent complete, 18 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Pasture condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 40 percent fair, 44 percent good, and 9 percent excellent.
