Missouri Crop Progress and Condition (05/16/16)

Wet weather limited fieldwork across much of the state. There were 2.9 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending May 15. Temperatures averaged 62.2 degrees, 0.8 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.85 inches statewide, 0.81 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 8 percent short, 77 percent adequate, and 12 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 8 percent short, 82 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. Corn planting was 96 percent complete, 15 percentage points ahead of last year and 18 percentage points ahead the 5-year average. Corn emerged progressed to 85 percent, 31 points ahead of the 5-year average. Soybean planting progressed to 31 percent complete. Soybeans emerged progressed to 14 percent complete. Cotton planting was 91 percent complete, 20 percentage points ahead of last year and 38 percentage points ahead of the 5-year average. Rice emerged progressed to 93 percent. Wheat headed reached 90 percent, compared to 68 percent last year and 69 percent for the 5-year average. Winter wheat condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 3 percent poor, 28 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 11 percent excellent. Pasture condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 44 percent fair, 47 percent good, and 3 percent excellent. Spring tillage is 92 percent complete, compared to both 80 percent last year and for the 5-year average.
