

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 4/13/20

Temperatures last week averaged 56.4 degrees, 4.2 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.31 inches statewide, 0.54 inches below normal. There were 5.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending April 12, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 25 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 24 percent surplus. Corn planted progressed to 4 percent this week, 1 percentage point behind last year. Rice planted progressed to 3 percent, 10 percentage points behind the 5-year average. Winter wheat condition was rated at 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 42 percent fair, 42 percent good, and 7 percent excellent.
