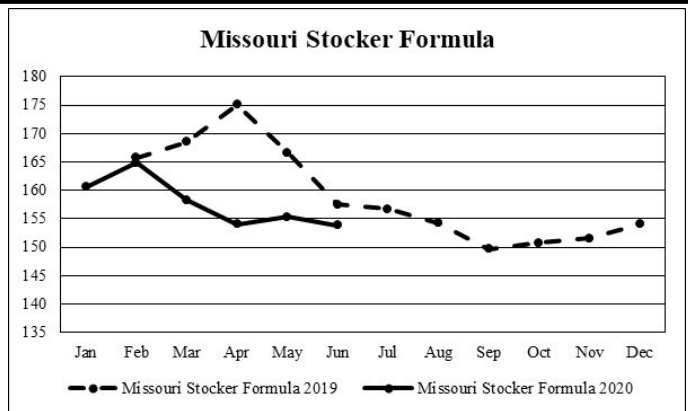

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 07/27/20

Temperatures last week averaged 80.1 degrees, 2.2 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 1.14 inches statewide, 0.16 inches above normal. There were 5.3 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending July 26, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 5 percent very short, 21 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 3 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 18 percent short, 78 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Corn silking was at 89 percent this week, 16 percentage points ahead of last year. Corn dough progressed to 38 percent, 1 percentage point behind the 5-year average. Corn condition was rated at 2 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 20 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 16 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming progressed to 62 percent, 28 percentage points ahead of last year. Soybean setting pods progressed to 27 percent. Soybeans condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 24 percent fair, 58 percent good, and 11 percent excellent. Cotton squaring progressed to 56 percent, 20 percentage points behind last year. Cotton setting bolls progressed to 22 percent, 2 percentage points ahead of last year. Cotton condition was rated at 2 percent very poor, 11 percent poor, 37 percent fair, and 50 percent good. Rice headed progressed to 19 percent, 7 percentage points ahead of last year. Rice condition was rated at 1 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 22 percent fair, 39 percent good, and 30 percent excellent.

Compared to last week, feeder steers and heifers sold steady to 5.00 higher, with some instances of up to 8.00 higher on mid-weight steers mostly in the 650-750 lb. range. The supply of feeder was light to moderate and demand was moderate to good. Cooler temperatures and moisture was welcomed and should give crops and pastures a nice boost as August arrives. Last Friday saw the release of two USDA reports, the monthly cattle on feed report and the semi-annual inventory report. The Cattle on Feed showed 100 percent On Feed, 102 percent Placements, 101 Marketed. The Cattle Inventory report showed total numbers slightly above year ago, with Beef cow numbers down one percent and estimated calf crop down one percent. As of Thursday's close boxed beef cutout values are mixed for the week, choice closed at 201.80 up .03 and select at 191.50 down .13.00 compared to last Friday's close. Feedlot sales saw most of this week's volume on Wednesday live sales were reported steady to 3.00 higher from 97.00-102.00 and dressed sales 2.00 higher at 160.00. Friday's Missouri Stocker Formula consisted of 4359 head with a weighted average of 556.71 lbs. and a price value of 154.65, 1.61 higher than last Friday. Supply included: 89% Feeder Cattle (55% Steers, 40% Heifers, 5% Bulls); 9% Slaughter Cattle (2% Steers, 1% Heifers, 82% Cows, 15% Bulls); 3% Replacement Cattle (18% Stock Cows, 61% Bred Cows, 2% Bred Heifers, 18% Cow-Calf Pairs, 1% Bulls). Feeder cattle supply over 600 lbs was 53%.
