

Missouri Crop Progress and Condition 09/14/20

Temperatures last week averaged 69.1 degrees, 2.0 degree below normal. Precipitation averaged 1.26 inches statewide, 0.33 inches above average. There were 3.7 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending September 13, 2020. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 15 percent short, 77 percent adequate, and 7 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 20 percent short, 77 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Corn denting was 96 percent compared to the 5-year average of 92 percent. Corn mature progressed to 44 percent compared to the 5-year average of 55 percent. Corn harvested for grain was 6 percent complete compared to the 5-year average of 15 percent. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 20 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 17 percent excellent. Soybeans turning color was 26 percent compared to the 5-year average of 33 percent. Soybeans dropping leaves was 6 percent compared to the 5-year average of 10 percent. Soybean condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 3 percent poor, 23 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 16 percent excellent. Corn harvest has officially started now. Crops have a lot of variance as far as maturity goes. Some fields are being harvested while others perhaps just across the road might still be fully green growing. Feedlot sales through Thursday saw negotiated volume of just shy of 87k head, sales have been higher for the week. Live sales were reported from 103.00 to 108.00 mostly around 104.00-105.00. Dressed sales reported from 162.00-165.00. As of Thursdays close box beef cut-outs continue to decline each week. Choice was down 4.84 at 215.05 and select down 3.71 at 203.39 compared to last Friday's close. Friday's Missouri Stocker Formula consisted of 4495 head with a weighted average weight of 549.71 and a price value of 152.30, 0.16 lower than last Friday's value.
