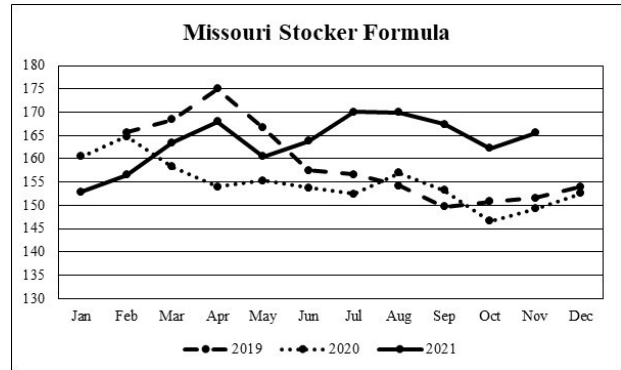

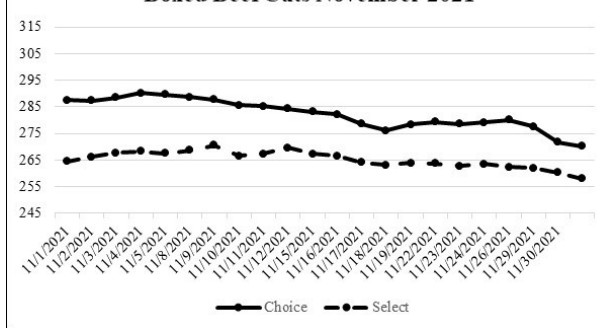

Compared to last week, feeders sold steady to 5.00 higher. Several barns saw more gains locally, as they were closed last week for the holidays and had to make up for two weeks of market gains. Steer calves also didn't see all the extreme highs that were reached at some of last week's special sales, but overall the market continues to climb. The supply of feeders was heavy, as typical for the weeks between the holidays. Thus far, weather has not been of any concern for transportation, as there has been very little moisture in any form over the last few weeks. It has actually been unseasonably warm and record highs were set in many areas of the state a few days late last week. Boxed beef cutouts fell a bit this week, with choice closing on Friday at 274.36, down 5.65 and select at 258.64, down 3.64 compared to last week. Feedlot sales continue to climb with good volume of negotiated trade and chain speed on the slaughter side. Nearly 110K head were reported, as of the Friday afternoon report. Live sales were mostly 138.00-142.00 and dressed sales mostly at 220.00 for the week. MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 11/29/21

There were 6.2 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending November 28, 2021. Temperatures last week averaged 40.2 degrees statewide, 0.4 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.34 inches, 0.56 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 11 percent short, and 88 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 13 percent short, 85 percent adequate, and 1 percent surplus. Soybeans harvested was 95 percent complete, even with the 5-year average. Cotton harvested was 97 percent complete, even with the 5-year average. Winter wheat planted was 94 percent, even with the 5-year average. Winter wheat emerged was 86 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 81 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 4 percent poor, 34 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 6 percent excellent.
