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

#### **Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 08/01/22**


Compared to last week, steer calves sold 5.00 to 10.00 higher, yearling steers and all heifers sold steady to 5.00 higher. The supply of feeders was light to moderate. Offerings were more typical of late July and a lighter than what has been seen the last several weeks. Heavy to extreme amounts of rain fell across north Missouri causing severe flooding in areas in and around St. Louis. The southern half of the state saw some rains mid to late week, not before the drought monitor was released on Thursday however which showed a big increase in the about classified as D3 or Extreme Drought. The hope of these rains was partly what kept receipts down a bit as potential rains gave farmers enough hope to hold off on selling at the current time. Not all areas in the south received rain and even those that did will need much more to turn the current situation around as two or three inches isn't going to do it. A few sale highlights this week included five loads of 850-900 lb. steers that sold at Unionville Livestock Market from 179.25-180.00. Joplin Regional Stockyards sold 105 head of 631 lb. steers at 195.50. The number that is most eye catching this week however, came from MO-KAN Livestock Market where they sold 112 head of 502 lb. steers for 224.25. Feedlot sales for the week as of Friday afternoon totaled just over 72K head. Live sales were reported from 135.00-145.00 and dressed sales 224.00-225.00. Boxed beef cutouts were mixed for the week. Choice closed Friday at 269.24, up 2.12 and select closed at 242.25, down 0.25 compared to last week. 





Broiler-Type Eggs Set in the United States Up 1 Percent

Hatcheries in the United States weekly program set 242 million eggs in incubators during the week ending July 23, 2022, up 1 percent from a year ago. Average hatchability for chicks hatched during the week in the United States was 80.1 percent. Average hatchability is calculated by dividing chicks hatched during the week by eggs set three-weeks earlier. Broiler-Type Chicks Placed in the United States Up 2 Percent

Broiler growers in the United States weekly program placed 189 million chicks for meat production during the week ending July 23, 2022, up 2 percent from a year ago. Cumulative placements from the week ending January 8, 2022 through July 23, 2022 for the United States were 5.44 billion. Cumulative placements were up slightly from the same period a year earlier.

#### PEANUT STOCKS AND PROCESSING

Shelled Edible Grade Season to Date Utilization Down 1 Percent from Last Year

Peanut Stocks in Commercial Storage Totaled 2.77 Billion Pounds Peanut stocks reported in commercial storage on June 30, 2022 totaled 2.77 billion pounds of equivalent farmer stock, compared with 2.38 billion pounds a year ago. This total includes 1.97 billion pounds of actual farmer stock.

Shelled peanuts on hand totaled 769 million pounds of farmer stock equivalent. Roasting stock totaled 31.5 million pounds. Shelled peanut stocks totaled 578 million pounds of which 550 million pounds were edible grades and 27.8 million pounds were oil stocks. Edible grade stocks by type included 76.4 million pounds of Virginias and Valencias, 441 million pounds of Runners, and 32.9 million pounds of Spanish. Millings in June totaled 408 million pounds. Millings by type were 45.9 million pounds of Virginias and Valencias, 346 million pounds of

Runners, and 16.2 million pounds of Spanish.

Commercial processors utilized 205 million pounds of shelled edible grade peanuts during June. Utilization by type was 114 million pounds for all peanut butter products, 41.9 million pounds for peanut candy, and 43.4 million pounds for peanut snacks. Crushing for oil and cake and meal totaled 49.4 million pounds during the month.

Deliveries under the Government Domestic Feeding and Child Nutrition Programs amounted to 1.97 million pounds of peanut butter and 130

thousand pounds of roasted peanuts during June.

Stocks of treated seed on hand June 30, 2022 totaled 1.90 million pounds, compared with 12.7 million pounds on May 31, 2022. Of the June total, 1.24 million pounds were Runners. May stocks of treated seed included 10.7 million pounds of Runners.

Stocks estimates refer to June 30, 2022. All other data are for the month of June.

#### **MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 07/28/22**

Extremely different stories from one end of the state to the other. The intensity of the drought in southern Missouri, as expected, increased tremendously with the release of the latest drought monitor. Nearly twenty percent of the state is now listed in D3 or Extreme Drought status. A few areas received a little rain and they are holding hope the forecast for the next few days and weekend of much cooler weather and some rain pan out. The northern part of the state received significant to excessive rainfall in a very short period of time. The highest reports were around the St. Louis area with one location receiving an official total of over 11 inches in less than 24 hours breaking several records. Rain of that amount basically just causes floods and does little good. It has seemed that the north has received rain about any time they needed it this year and crops look very good. A fair amount of hay moving from the north to the south now. Hay prices are steady to firm with asking prices seeing a fair bit of variance from areas that are dry to areas that are not, trucking however adds a fair amount to total cost as fuel is still high.
