Missouri Steer (Heifer) Stocker Formula for 08/08/2022



This a rolling seven day calculated weighted value which combines all Feeder Steers reported by MDA/USDA Market News Service weighing from 400-649 lbs. in the Medium and Large 1 and Medium and Large 1-2 frame and muscle classifications, including all comment cattle except Brahman X. Heifer values are in parentheses.

Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 08/08/22

Compared to last week, feeders sold steady to 5.00 higher. Supply was moderate. Receipts were pretty typical of a summer run. Extreme heat and humidity made transporting cattle risky which led to lighter runs at most barns. Several areas in southern Missouri finally seen some rain, providing a little hope that maybe conditions will turn around. Although those in extreme drought status (D3) will need a lot more moisture over an extended time to really change much. A couple of stick out sales both came from Callaway Livestock Center last Monday where they sold 60 head of 870 lb. steers at 182.00. Another stick out draft at the same sale consisted of 85 head of 608 lb. steers which sold for 213.00. Boxed beef cuts outs were lower for the week. Choice closed at 264.62, down 4.62 and select closed at 238.67, down 3.58 compared to a week ago. Feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled just under 102K head. Live sales in the south were mostly 135.00-136.00, in the north from 140.00-147.00. Dressed sales were reported from 225.00-232.00. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 4205 head with a weighted average weight of 553.89 and a price value of 197.24, up 1.56 from last week. The steer/heifer spread is 27.92.





#### GRAIN CRUSHINGS AND CO-PRODUCTS PRODUCTION

Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 492 million bushels in June 2022. Total corn consumption was down 2 percent from May 2022 but up less than 1 percent from June 2021. June 2022 usage included 91.6 percent for alcohol and 8.4 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol and 6.7 percent for other pulposes. 21 percent from May 2022 and down 1 percent from June 2021. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 442 million bushels, was down 1 percent from May 2022 but up 1 percent from June 2021. Corn consumed in June 2022 for day million for fuel and the state with the full of the state of the

dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 91.8 percent and 8.2 percent, respectively. **Dry mill co-product production** of distillers dried grains with solubles (DDGS) was 1.92 million tons during June 2022, up 1 percent from Max 2022 but down between the solutions for the solution of the soluti May 2022 but down less than 1 percent from June 2021. Distillers wet grains (DWG) 65 percent or more moisture was 1.28 million tons in June 2022, down 3 percent from May 2022 but up 15 percent from June 2021. Wet mill corn gluten feed production was 287,211 tons during June 2022, down 2 percent from May 2022 and down less than 1 percent from June 2021. Wet corn gluten feed 40 to 60 percent moisture was 202,951 tons in June 2022, down 1 percent from May 2022 and down 2 percent from June 2021.

#### FLOUR MILLING PRODUCTS

All wheat ground for flour during the second quarter 2022 was 232 million bushels, up 1 percent from the first quarter 2022 grind of 230 million bushels and up 4 percent from the second quarter 2021 grind of 223 million bushels. Second quarter 2022 total flour production was 107 million hundredweight, up 1 percent from the first quarter 2022 and up 4 million hundredweight, up 1 percent from the first quarter 2022 and up 4 percent from the second quarter 2021. Whole wheat flour production at 4.54 million hundredweight during the second quarter 2022 accounted for 4 percent of the total flour production. Millfeed production from wheat in the second quarter 2022 was 1.68 million tons. The daily 24-hour milling capacity of wheat flour during the second quarter 2022 was 1.50 million hundredweight. 1.59 million hundredweight.

**Durum wheat** ground for flour and semolina production during the second quarter of 2022 totaled 15.4 million bushels, down 4 percent from the first quarter 2022 but up less than 1 percent from the second quarter 2021. Second quarter 2022 durum flour and semolina production was 7.49 million hundredweight, down 2 percent from the first quarter 2022 but up 3 percent from the second quarter 2021. Whole wheat du-rum flour and semolina production was 84.0 thousand hundredweight, down 12 percent from 95.0 thousand hundredweight in the first quarter 2022 and down 43 percent from 147 thousand hundredweight from the second quarter 2021. Second quarter durum wheat millfeed production was 102 thousand tons and the daily 24-hour milling capacity for durum and semolina production was 135 thousand hundredweight.

Rye ground for flour during the second quarter of 2022 was 391 thousand bushels, down 11 percent from the first quarter 2022 and down 12 percent from the second quarter 2021. Rye flour production during the second quarter of 2022 was 174 thousand hundredweight, compared to 200 thousand hundredweight in the previous quarter and 201 thou-sand hundredweight in the same quarter for the previous year. The daily 24-hour milling capacity for rye milling was 9.66 thousand hundred-weight for the second quarter 2022.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 08/04/22 Most areas in the southern half of the state are finally seeing some much needed rain. Although it will take a fair amount to soak in, replenish the soil, and end the drought, often it seems the first rain is the hardest to get. Areas that were just on the break of moderate to severe quickly greened back up which was a very welcome site, but it will take a lot more time and moisture for many of the severe to extreme areas to see any change. Hay movement has been good as cattle farmers in the drought areas have been trying to hold on to as many cattle as possible Finding hay locally however has been tough and trucking cost to get hay brought in haven't been cheap either, if trucks could even be found to haul it.
