

Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 08/15/22


Compared to last week, feeders sold steady to 5.00 higher. The supply of feeders was light to moderate. Oppressive heat early week kept some cattle from making it to town and recent rains over some of the driest areas of the state have provided some hope to those that haven't already sold calves earlier than usual. Overall this week's offering was pretty typical of a late summer run. Still a few loads of yearlings scattered around but offerings are becoming more calves now. Demand was moderate to good. State wide the severity of drought conditions has gotten better with the recent rains but total area has increased as some areas in Northwest MO and a small line across the Iowa boarder was added as abnormally dry in the latest drought monitor. Boxed beef cutouts closed the week mixed. Choice closed at 263.37, down 1.25 and select at 239.59, up 0.92 compared to previous week. Feedlot sales as of Friday afternoon totaled right at 98.5k head. Live sales in the south were mostly at 140.00 and in the north 144.00-148.00, with dressed sales at 229.00-230.00. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 3493 head with a weighted average weight of 553.14 lbs. and a price value of 198.50, up 1.26 from the previous week. The steer/heifer spread was 25.41.







MISSOURI CROP PRODUCTION

Corn: Planted area is estimated at 3.6 million acres, the same as last year. Harvested area, forecast at 3.43 million acres, is also the same as last year. Based on August 1 conditions, the Missouri corn yield is forecast at 153 bushels per acre, down 7 bushels from 2021. Production is forecast at 525 million bushels, 4 percent below last year's production. Soybeans: Planted area is estimated at 5.90 million acres, up 4 percent from last year. Harvested area, forecast at 5.85 million acres, is up 4 percent from 2021. Based on August 1 conditions, the Missouri soybean yield is forecast at 49 bushels per acre, the same from 2021. Production is forecast at 287 million bushels, up 4 percent from 2021. Winter Wheat: Harvested area in 2022 is forecast at 660,000 acres, up 35 percent from last year. The winter wheat yield is forecast at 66 bushels per acre, up 1 bushel from 2021. Production is forecast at 43.6 million bushels, up 37 percent from the previous year. Cotton: Harvested area is forecast at 320,000 acres, up 3 percent from last year. Based on August 1 conditions, the Missouri cotton yield is forecast at 975 pounds per acre, down 285 pounds from last year. Production is forecast at 650,000 bales (480-pound), down 20 percent from last year. Rice: Planted area, estimated at 189,000 acres, is down 5 percent from 2021. Harvested area is forecast at 184,000 acres, down 5 percent from last year. Based on August 1 conditions, the Missouri rice yield is forecast at 7,800 pounds per acre, down 240 pounds per acre from 2021. Production is forecast at 14.4 million cwt, down 8 percent from last year.

US CROP PRODUCTION

Corn production for grain is forecast at 14.4 billion bushels, down 5 percent from 2021. Based on conditions as of August 1, yields are expected to average 175.4 bushels per harvested acre, down 1.6 bushels from last year. Area harvested for grain is forecast at 81.8 million acres, down less than 1 percent from the June forecast and down 4 percent from the previous year. Soybean production for beans is forecast at a record high 4.53 billion bushels, up 2 percent from 2021. Based on conditions as of August 1, yields are expected to average a record high 51.9 bushels per harvested acre, up 0.5 bushel from 2021. Total planted area, at 88.0 million acres, is down less than 1 percent from the previous estimate but up 1 percent from the previous year. Area harvested for beans in the United States is forecast at 87.2 million acres, down less than 1 percent from the previous forecast but up 1 percent from 2021. All wheat production for grain is forecast at 1.78 billion bushels, up less than 1 percent from the previous forecast and up 8 percent from 2021. Based on August 1 conditions, yields are expected to average 47.5 bushels per harvested acre, up 0.2 bushel from the previous forecast and up 3.2 bushels from 2021. Area harvested for grain is forecast at 37.5 million acres, down less than 1 percent from the previous forecast, but up 1 percent from 2021.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 08/11/22

Overall drought conditions in the state were much improved over last week following several rains that fell over the southern half of the state the last couple of weeks. Oddly enough there is now a few areas in northwest and along the Iowa boarder that are showing as abnormally dry. Although the area considered to be in extreme drought declined by over 11 percent that still doesn't mean everything is great. These areas still need more moisture over several weeks to really see any recovery. Along with the moisture cooler temperatures have also been a huge relief. That being said many are still feeding or providing something extra for livestock they have managed to hold on to. Hay movement is moderate, demand is moderate to good and prices are steady to firm.
