

#### **Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary** 11/21/2022

Compared to last week, feeders were uneven from 2.00 lower to 2.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate and although there was several larger consignments many reporters noted a larger number of smaller odds and ends this week with overall quality not quite matching what was seen last week. For several barns this was the last sale prior to Thanksgiving. There are several other barns however that are holding special sales next week with some large numbers expected at those scheduled sales. The monthly Cattle on Feed Report was released on Friday and numbers should be viewed as bullish. On feed numbers reported at 99 percent of a year ago that was just slightly above the average pre report estimate but still within the ranges. Marketings were pretty much right in line with expectations at 101 percent. The big news came from the placement number which was reported at 94 percent which was two percent below the average estimate and slightly below the very bottom end of the range. It was also noted that this was the smallest Oct placement number recorded since the report began in 1996. The largest draft this week was from Joplin Regional Stockyards which sold 533 head of 844 lb. steers with one drop of the hammer at 177.00. The second largest draft was also at Joplin Regional Stockyards but was a draft of heifers 307 head with an average weight of 920 lbs. and sold for 157.00. A couple other notable loads this week included a load of 529 lbs. steers tagged as thin fleshed which sold at Green City Livestock Market on Wednesday at 220.50 and finally another load of steers with an average weight of 907 lbs. sold at Callaway Livestock Center for 175.00. Boxed beef cutouts were lower this week choice closed at 254.87, down 4.07 and select closed at 232.83, down 2.44 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of Friday afternoon was near 87K head and sold higher. Live sales were reported 150.00-155.00 with a few late week sales at 156.00, dressed sales mostly at 242.00. 

#### **Cattle on Feed**

United States Cattle on Feed Down 2 Percent

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.7 million head on November 1, 2022. The inventory was 2 percent below November 1, 2021.

Placements in feedlots during October totaled 2.11 million head, 6 percent below 2021. Placements were the lowest for October since the series began in 1996. Net placements were 2.05 million head. During October, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 545,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 465,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 450,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 378,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 190,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 80,000 head.

Marketings of fed cattle during October totaled 1.80 million head, 1 percent above 2021.

Other disappearance totaled 54,000 head during October, 5 percent below 2021.

#### **Peanut Prices**

#### Peanut Price Highlights

Peanut prices received by farmers for all farmer stock peanuts averaged 30.7 cents per pound for the week ending November 12, up 2.4 cents from the previous week. Marketings of all farmer stock peanuts for the week ending November 12 totaled 52.8 million pounds, down 46.4 million pounds from the previous week.

Runner-type peanut prices averaged 28.8 cents per pound for the week ending November 12, up 2.7 cents from the previous week. Marketings of runner-type peanuts totaled 43.8 million pounds, down 46.3 million pounds from the previous week.

#### **MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 11/17/2022**

Record high temperatures from last week were, as predicted, replaced by winter. Temperatures more in line with January, rather than early November settled across the state. The first snow of the year fell for most of the state with some areas receiving two rounds of the white stuff. Three or four inches in a few areas had several farmers rolling out the first hay of the year. There are many however, that have been feeding at least some for a while due to drought, that prevented any stockpiling of fall forages. Hay supplies are light to moderate. There is still at this time adequate amounts of hay that can be found and bought, although price levels are tough to swallow, even as they still unlikely cover the cost of what production cost this year. Demand for hay and hay movement is moderate. Hay prices are fully steady to slightly firm.
