



This a rolling seven day calculated weighted value which combines all Feeder Steers reported by MDA/USDA Market News Service weighing from 400-649 lbs. in the Medium and Large 1 and Medium and Large 1-2 frame and muscle classifications, including all comment cattle except Brahman X. Heifer values are in parentheses.

#### **Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 12/19/2022**

Compared to the last week, feeders sold unevenly steady to 2.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate and made up of mostly mid-weights with not near as many in any single weight class, especially the feather weights and heavy weights which was responsible for some of the unevenness of the markets. Demand was moderate to good. Quality is a bit harder to find currently and mostly just a timing issue as much of this years' marketing is complete with many producers holding cattle for the post-holiday run now. Although 75 percent of the state is still officially in some stage of drought recent rains have led many to feeding in the mud currently. Cold weather setting in is going to firm up and ground especially into next week when it could become dangerously cold. What few producers that aren't already feeding full diets will be by Christmas. As mentioned earlier this week's supply was lighter than the last few weeks and not near as many load lots or big drafts in the offering this week. One that did stick out was 69 head of steers, tagged fancy which sold on Tuesday at Lolli Brothers Livestock Market in Macon with an average weight of 613 lbs. and sold for 205.00. Boxed beef cutouts were sharply higher this week. Choice closed at 262.83, up 13.90 and select closed the week at 235.45, up 14.19 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of Friday afternoon was just over 74K. Live sales were reported mostly from 155.00-157.00, dressed sales mostly at 248.00. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 6616 head with a weighted average weight of 547.09 lbs. and a price value of 195.01, up 1.53 from last week. The steer/heifer spread is 24.39.



Eggs in Incubators on December 1 Up 2 Percent from Last Year Turkey eggs in incubators on December 1, 2022 in the United States totaled 26.5 million, up 2 percent from December 1, 2021. Eggs in incubators were up slightly from the November 1, 2022 total of 26.5 million eggs

#### **MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 12/15/2022**

Rains have resulted in many areas dealing with some mud now. Despite that it is possible to get stuck just over 75 percent of the state is still officially listed on the drought monitor, with most of that falling in the slightly too abnormally dry categories. A few small areas totaling just over five percent of the state are still listed as severely dry. Most everyone is feeding a near full diet to livestock now and with the extreme cold weather predicted next week those that aren't will be. Hay movement remains good, the supply of hay is light to moderate, demand is moderate, and prices mostly steady.
