
Monday's Missouri Stocker Formula consists of 12,766 (11,731) head with a weighted average weight of 558.93 (547.79) lbs. and a price value of 198.48 (174.79, with no available comparison to a week ago.

This a rolling seven day calculated weighted value which combines all Feeder Steers reported by MDA/USDA Market News Service weighing from 400-649 lbs. in the Medium and Large 1 and Medium and Large 1-2 frame and muscle classifications, including all comment cattle except Brahman X. Heifer values are in parentheses.

Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 01/09/2023

Compared to the last test of the market which was two weeks ago in most cases, feeders sold steady to 5.00 higher. There were several instances of 10.00 higher, however some of that had to be attributed to factors of overall better quality and the supply of larger lot sizes compared to the last preholiday sales. The supply of feeders was heavy which was expected as the first full week of the New Year is typically the largest volume week of the year as long as weather cooperates. Here in Missouri the weather did cooperate however there was a few buyers at various barns that were not back in the market yet as winter weather did prevent receiving and processing of new cattle in some states especially Nebraska. Demand was good to very good, buyers were eager to fill orders and earn some commission following the holidays after being off a week or two and feedlot managers were ready to put some cattle back into pins. Load lots were plentiful with roughly 125 load and multi load lots sold around the state at auction barns this week. The largest draft was 396 head of 677 lb. heifers which sold for 180.00 at Windsor Livestock Action, which was hosting the qualifying for the World Livestock Auctioneer Championship. Another eye catching sale was 59 head of 919 lb. steers which sold for 177.10 at Callaway Livestock Center. State wide over 2200 head of Medium and Large 1 steers 600-650 lbs. averaged 191.10. The slaughter cow market was sharply higher this week adding some value to the cull cows as momma cows continue to leave farms and has yet to really slow down. Boxed beef cutouts were mixed as choice closed at 281.63, down 0.35 and select closed at 256.95, up 6.02 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of Friday afternoon was just under 68k head. Live sales were reported mostly from 157.00-160.00, dressed sales mostly at 252.00. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 12,766 head with a weighted average weight of 558.93 lbs. and a price value of 198.48, no comparison last week due to the holidays. The steer/heifer spread is 23.69.







GRAIN CRUSHINGS AND CO-PRODUCTS PRODUCTION 01/03/2023

Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 498 million bushels in November 2022. Total corn consumption was down 1 percent from October 2022 and down 4 percent from November 2021. November 2022 usage included 91.9 percent for alcohol and 8.1 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 4.42 million bushels, down 4 percent from October 2022 and down 8 percent from November 2021. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 447 million bushels, was down less than 1 percent from October 2022 and down 4 percent from November 2021. Corn consumed in November 2022 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 92.2 percent and 7.8 percent, respectively.

Dry mill co-product production of distillers dried grains with solubles (DDGS) was 1.78 million tons during November 2022, up 2 percent from October 2022 but down 11 percent from November 2021. Distillers wet grains (DWG) 65 percent or more moisture was 1.46 million tons in November 2022, up 5 percent from October 2022 and up 10 percent from November 2021.

CONSUMPTION AND STOCKS 01/03/2023

Soybeans crushed for crude oil was 5.68 million tons (189 million bushels) in November 2022, compared with 5.90 million tons (197 million bushels) in October 2022 and 5.72 million tons (191 million bushels) in November 2021. Crude oil produced was 2.20 billion pounds down 6 percent from October 2022 and down 2 percent from November 2021. Soybean once refined oil production at 1.63 billion pounds during November 2022 decreased 9 percent from October 2022 and decreased 2 percent from November 2021.

Canola seeds crushed for crude oil was 180,750 tons in November 2022, compared with 208,459 tons in October 2022 and 160,197 tons in November 2021. Canola crude oil produced was 145 million pounds, down 15 percent from October 2022 but up 16 percent from November 2021. Canola once refined oil production, at 144 million pounds during November 2022, was down 10 percent from October 2022 but up 3 percent from November 2021.

Cottonseed once refined oil production, at 37.1 million pounds during November 2022, was down 7 percent from October 2022 but up 15 percent from November 2021.

Edible tallow production was 69.4 million pounds during November 2022, down 14 percent from October 2022 and down 20 percent from November 2021. Inedible tallow production was 361 million pounds during November 2022, down 4 percent from October 2022 and down 4 percent from November 2021. Technical tallow production was 125 million pounds during November 2022, up 10 percent from October 2022 but down less than 1 percent from November 2021. Choice white grease production, at 117 million pounds during November 2022, increased 8 percent from October 2022 but decreased 10 percent from November 2021.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 01/05/2023

Following the deep freeze just prior to Christmas, weather conditions have been awfully pleasant over the last two weeks. Rains and warm temperatures which actually set new record highs in a few locations has caused some mud to develop. Although 50 percent of the state still sill showing on the drought monitor one farmer that was in one of the drier regions of the state reported there has been enough rain to make water run out the overflow of his pond and he couldn't recall the last time that happened. Quite a bit of hay moving around the state currently both locally on small trailers and some moving longer distances by the semi loads. The supply of hay is light to moderate, demand is moderate, and prices mostly steady.
