
Compared to last week, feeders sold steady to 5.00 higher, with instances of 10.00 higher on the lighter weights suitable for grazing. The supply of feeders was on the lower side of moderate and demand was good to very good. Heavy rains mid- week resulted in some flooding in the southern part of the state where the already saturated ground couldn't soak up the two to three inches that came in areas of the Ozarks. Temperatures climbed in to the low 70's over the weekend and several signs of spring are showing around the state, but as we all know that can change in a matter of minutes and the state could easily be under several inches of snow in no time. However an early spring with an abundance of grass and pastures would most assuredly be welcomed by all. Load lots of calves under 700 lbs. were fairly uncommon this week although there were still several parts loads in the offering, a few loads of heavier weights were present. Some highlights of the more sizeable drafts this week included 21 head of 510 lb. steers as South Central Regional Stockyards which sold at 255.00, 27 head of 627 lb. steers sold at Green City Livestock Market for 230.50, 46 head of 705 lb. steers at Windsor Livestock Action at 207.00, Green City Livestock Market also sold a load of 797 lb. steers at 191.50, and finally two loads of 867 lb. steers sold at Callaway Livestock Center at 183.75. Boxed beef cutouts were mixed for the week. Choice closed the week at 289.32, up 2.04 and select closed at 276.86, down 0.23 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of Friday afternoon totaled just over 71K head. Most trade once again waiting until Friday to develop live sales were reported from 164.00-166.00 and dressed sales 262.00-265.00. 





FATS AND OILS: OILSEED CRUSHINGS, PRODUCTION, CONSUMPTION AND STOCKS

Soybeans crushed for crude oil was 5.73 million tons (191 million bushels) in January 2023, compared with 5.62 million tons (187 million bushels) in December 2022 and 5.83 million tons (194 million bushels) in January 2022. Crude oil produced was 2.25 billion pounds, up 3 per-cent from December 2022 but down 1 percent from January 2022. Soy-bean once refined oil production at 1.72 billion pounds during January 2023 increased 9 percent from December 2022 and increased 8 percent from January 2022.

Canola seeds crushed for crude oil was 204,340 tons in January 2023, compared with 181,455 tons in December 2022 and 136,632 tons in January 2022. Canola crude oil produced was 166 million pounds, up 14 percent from December 2022 and up 47 percent from January 2022. Canola once refined oil production, at 157 million pounds during January 2023, was up 16 percent from December 2022 and up 28 percent from January 2022.

Cottonseed once refined oil production, at 37.2 million pounds during January 2023, was up 37 percent from December 2022 but down 6 percent from January 2022.

Edible tallow production was 84.4 million pounds during January 2023, up 9 percent from December 2022 and up 20 percent from January 2022. Inedible tallow production was 352 million pounds during January 2023, down 1 percent from December 2022 but up 34 percent from January 2022. Technical tallow production was 107 million pounds during January 2023, up 7 percent from December 2022 and up 15 percent from January 2023, up 7 percent from December 2022 and up percent from January 2022. Choice white grease production, at 115 million pounds during January 2023, increased 3 percent from December 2022 and in-creased 5 percent from January 2022.

GRAIN CRUSHINGS AND CO-PRODUCTS PRODUCTION

Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 494 million bushels in January 2023. Total corn consumption was up 4 percent from December 2022 but down 4 percent from January 2022. January 2023 usage included 92.1 percent for alcohol and 7.9 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 6.08 million bushels, up 37 percent from December 2022 and up 61 percent from January 2022. 37 percent from December 2022 and up 61 percent from January 2022. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 444 million bushels, was up 4 percent from December 2022 but down 4 percent from January 2022. Corn consumed in January 2023 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 91.6 percent and 8.4 percent, respectively. **Dry mill co-product production** of distillers dried grains with solu-bles (DDGS) was 1.71 million tons during January 2023 up 2 percent

bles (DDGS) was 1.71 million tons during January 2023, up 2 percent from December 2022 but down 11 percent from January 2022. Distillers wet grains (DWG) 65 percent or more moisture was 1.26 million tons in January 2023, down 7 percent from December 2022 and down 11 per-cent from January 2022.

Wet mill corn gluten feed production was 268,446 tons during January 2023, up 6 percent from December 2022 but down 1 percent from January 2022. Wet corn gluten feed 40 to 60 percent moisture was 208,090 tons in January 2023, up 10 percent from December 2022 and up 6 percent from January 2022.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 03/02/23

There is an old saying that rain makes grass and if that is true, the state should be lush and very green soon. The latest drought monitor shows only 4 percent of the state in any state of dryness. A huge improvement from the start of the calendar year when over 63 percent was showing. With the arrival of March many producers will be thinking about spreading fertilizer in the coming weeks. Although still high prices have declined significantly from last year with most ingredients 11 to 25 percent lower than a year ago. The supply of hay is light, demand is moderate and prices are steady.
