

Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 03/20/2023


Compared to last week, feeders sold mostly steady to 5.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate and demand was good. Auction barns continue to see more cattle than most really expected to still be available by this time. Spring has officially arrived but winter was able to get at least one more jab in with a hard freeze over the weekend. This made several early flowing plants look quite sad. The monthly cattle on feed report was released on Friday. Pre-report estimates were spot on with the actual report. The on feed number was at 96%, placements at 93%, and marketings at 95% of year ago levels. This makes the report mostly neutral but does continue to support the currently overall bullish fundamentals of the market. A few of the top load lots this week included 70 head of 561 lb. steers at Callaway Livestock Center which sold at 260.50. Joplin Regional Stockyards sold 72 head of 709 lb. steers at 209.50 and Kingsville Livestock Auction had a load of 64 head of 806 lb. steers for 187.00. Boxed beef cutouts were mixed for the week. Choice closed at 283.55, down 1.36 and select closed at 272.44, up 0.90 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of Friday afternoon totaled just over 73K head. Live sales were reported from 163.00-165.00 and dressed sales 263.00-264.00. 



NORTH AMERICAN GRAIN AND OILSEED CRUSHINGS

Combined United States and Canadian Soybeans Crushed Up 3 Percent From 2021

This publication is a result of a joint effort by Statistics Canada and USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service to release the soybean and canola seed crushings information for both countries within one publication. United States soybean and oilseed crushings numbers for 2022 were previously released on March 1, 2023. Canadian soybean and oilseed crushings were released on January 25, 2023.

Combined United States and Canadian soybeans crushed for crude oil was 67.9 million tons in 2022, an increase of 3 percent from 2021. Crude oil production was 26.8 billion pounds, up 3 percent from 2021.

Combined United States and Canadian canola seeds crushed for crude oil was 11.6 million tons in 2022, down 10 percent from 2021. Crude oil production was 9.57 billion pounds, down 13 percent from 2021.

HOP STOCKS

March 1 Hop Stocks Down 4 Percent from One Year Ago

The inventory of hops held by growers, dealers, and brewers on March 1, 2023 totaled 186 million pounds, down 4 percent from March 1, 2022 stocks inventory of 193 million pounds.

Stocks held at dealer and grower locations on March 1, 2023 totaled 159 million pounds. Stocks held by brewers totaled 27.0 million pounds.
