


Missouri Weekly Cattle Auction Summary 04/03/2023

Compared to last week, feeders sold fully steady to 5.00 higher. Markets bounced back from last week's slight down turn and were back to climbing. The supply of feeders was light to moderate. A few new crop calves were noted in the offerings as some producers are not wanting to chance missing out on the current price levels so they are pulling the fall calves and sending them straight to town. Overall supplies continue to be tight. Demand was moderate to good. The Heifer offering outnumbered steers and bulls this week with several load multi load lots selling around the state. Grass has sprung following a few warm days as of late. For many folks looking off their porch it would be hard to believe but there has actually been some corn planted and one reporter even witnessed a field that was already out of the ground. Several more fertilizer buggies were spotted the last few days but many are having to pick and choose where they drive carefully. A few notable sales this week included a part load of 518 lb. steers at Lolli Brothers Livestock Market which sold for 265.00. Callaway Livestock Center sold a load of 732 lb. steers for 208.75. Another load of 813 lb. steers sold at Kingsville Livestock Auction for 197.00. Several load and multi load lots of six weight heifers sold this week with a 2 in front of the price. New Cambria Livestock Market sold 114 head of 709 lb. heifers at 197.75. Boxed beef cutouts closed higher for the week. Choice closed at 282.07, up 2.19 and select closed at 270.72, up 1.97 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of Friday afternoon was near 93K head. Live sales were reported from 165.00-172.00 and dressed sales 270.00-272.00, with a few up to 277.50. Fed cattle prices for live sales are now within a breath of all time record highs set back right before Thanksgiving in 2014 and dressed prices are basically even with the records set in early 2015. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 4263 head with a weighted average weight of 534.11 lbs. and a price value of 232.28, 2.47 higher than last week. The steer/heifer spread is 30.95.







Corn Planted Acreage Up 4 Percent from 2022

Soybean Acreage Up Slightly All Wheat Acreage Up 9 Percent All Cotton Acreage Down 18 Percent

Corn planted area for all purposes in 2023 is estimated at 92.0 million acres, up 4 percent or 3.42 million acres from last year. Compared with last year, planted acreage is expected to be up or unchanged in 40 of the 48 estimating States.

Soybean planted area for 2023 is estimated at 87.5 million acres, up

Soybean planted area for 2023 is estimated at 87.5 million acres, up slightly from last year. Compared with last year, planted acreage is up or unchanged in 15 of the 29 estimating States.

All wheat planted area for 2023 is estimated at 49.9 million acres, up 9 percent from 2022. The 2023 winter wheat planted area, at 37.5 million acres, is up 13 percent from last year and up 2 percent from the previous estimate. Of this total, about 26.0 million acres are Hard Red Winter, 7.80 million acres are Soft Red Winter, and 3.71 million acres are White Winter. Area expected to be planted to other spring wheat for 2023 is estimated at 10.6 million acres, down 2 percent from 2022. Of this total, about 9.95 million acres are Hard Red Spring wheat. Durum planted area for 2023 is expected to total 1.78 million acres, up 9 percent from the previous year.

All cotton planted area for 2023 is estimated at 11.3 million acres, down 18 percent from last year. Upland area is estimated at 11.1 million acres, down 18 percent from 2022. American Pima area is estimated at 154,000 acres, down 16 percent from 2022.

GRAIN STOCK

Corn Stocks Down 5 Percent from March 2022 Soybean Stocks Down 13 Percent

All Wheat Stocks Down 8 Percent

Corn stocks in all positions on March 1, 2023 totaled 7.40 billion bushels, down 5 percent from March 1, 2022. Of the total stocks, 4.11 billion bushels were stored on farms, up 1 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, at 3.29 billion bushels, are down 10 percent from a year ago. The December 2022 - February 2023 indicated disappearance is 3.42 billion bushels, compared with 3.88 billion bushels during the same period last year.

Soybeans stored in all positions on March 1, 2023 totaled 1.69 billion bushels, down 13 percent from March 1, 2022. Soybean stocks stored on farms are estimated at 750 million bushels, down slightly from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 936 million bushels, are down 21 percent from last March. Indicated disappearance for the December 2022 - February 2023 quarter totaled 1.34 billion bushels, up 11 percent from the same

period a year earlier.

All wheat stored in all positions on March 1, 2023 totaled 946 million bushels, down 8 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks are estimated at 227 million bushels, up 30 percent from last March. Off-farm stocks, at 719 million bushels, are down 16 percent from a year ago. The December 2022 - February 2023 indicated disappearance is 366 million bushels, 5 percent above the same period a year earlier. Durum wheat stocks in all positions on March 1, 2023 totaled 35.8 million bushels, up 18 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks, at 17.1 million bushels, are up 36 percent from March 1, 2022. Off-farm stocks totaled 18.7 million bushels, up 6 percent from a year ago. The December 2022 - February 2023 indicated disappearance of 12.3 million bushels is 5 percent above the same period a year earlier.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 03/30/23

The state continues to wait for some extended dry time. A touch of fertilize has found its way on fields but not much as even most hillsides are too wet to get over without getting stuck. Pastures and hay fields seem ready to explode with growth as soon as some warmth arrives. At this time, still no reports of any planting taking place although everyone is itching and eager to get to work. The supply of hay is light, demand is moderate and prices are steady.
