


MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY 04/10/2023

Compared to last week, feeders sold 5.00 to 10.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate A good mixture of lighter weight calves all the way up to heavy weight load lots of yearlings in the offering this week. Price levels are resulting in some producers selling earlier than usual as well as bringing a few more heifers to town that were planned to be kept as replacements. Demand was good to very good. Grass is growing with the help of warmer temperatures and guys that graze but didn't have feed or a place to hold cattle are showing up to try to get acquire some inventory now. Some stick out sales this week included 39 head of 533 lb. steers at Ozark Regional Stockyards which sold for 265.00. Joplin Regional Stockyards sold 127 head of 770 lb. steers at 208.75. Green City Livestock Auction held their Annual April Grass sale which had several very impressive loads of reputation cattle including 62 head 715 lb. steers at 225.00 and 60 head of 856 lb. steers at 202.85. Boxed beef cutouts jumped higher this week as grilling season approaches and supplies of beef remain tight. Choice closed at 290.098, up 8.91 and select closed at 275.78, up 5.06 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of Friday afternoon was just over 102K head. Live sales were reported from 168.00 early up to 178.00 on later sales and dressed sales 274.00-280.00 with a few late 283.00. This was all time record high prices for both live and dressed sales blowing past the records set back in 2014-2015. The Missouri Stocker Formula consist of 6417 head with a weighted average weight of 530.16 lbs. and a price value of 238.71, 6.43 higher than last week. The steer/heifer spread is 26.61.







Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 444 million

from January 2023 and down 3 percent from February 2022. February 2023 usage included 91.9 percent for alcohol and 8.1 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 3.36 million bushels, down 45 percent from January 2023 and down 17 percent from February 2022. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 400 million bushels, was down 9 percent from January 2023 and down 2 percent from February 2022 Corn consumed in February 2023 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 91.5 percent and 8.5 percent, respectively.

Dry mill co-product production of distillers dried grains with solubles (DDGS) was 1.56 million tons during February 2023, down 9 percent from January 2023 and down 8 percent from February 2022. Distillers wet grains (DWG) 65 percent or more moisture was 1.16 million tons in February 2023, down's percent from January 2023 and down 11 percent from February 2022

Wet mill corn gluten feed production was 247,817 tons during Feb ruary 2023, down 8 percent from January 2023 but up 4 percent from February 2022. Wet corn gluten feed 40 to 60 percent moisture was

Canola crude oil produced was 137 million pounds, down 17 percent from January 2023 but up 36 percent from February 2022. Canola once refined oil production, at 144 million pounds during February 2023, was down 8 percent from January 2023 but up 48 percent from February 2022. Cottonseed once refined oil production, at 34.8 million pounds during February 2023, was down 6 percent from January 2023 and down 22 percent from February 2022.

MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION04/03/23

There were 3.0 days suitable for fieldwork during the week ending April 2, 2023. Temperatures last week averaged 49.3 degrees, 0.7 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 0.44 inches, 0.61 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply rated 1 percent very short, 3 percent short, 81 percent adequate, and 15 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply rated 2 percent very short, 11 percent short, 78 percent adequate, and 9 percent surplus. Winter wheat condition rated 1 percent very poor, 2 percent poor, 22 percent fair, 73 percent good, and 2 percent excellent.
