

### MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY


Compared to last week, as a whole feeders under 700 lbs. sold steady to 10.00 lower, over 700 lbs. sold steady to 5.00 higher. There was some local cases that didn't fit the overall trends this week. Early week there was some unevenness and sideways movement but pressure increased and as the week progressed it was undeniable that the calf market was undoubtedly lower. The supply of feeders was moderate to heavy still much above seasonal averages but not as heavy as last week. Demand was moderate, many buyers reported that orders were still present but at the current price levels there is just a lot of nervousness to push prices any higher. Although fundamentally there isn't any justified reasons for the market to have an overall extended turn lower, everyone is fearful of outside unrelated black swans or something of the sort that could cause chaos. Hay season is in full swing around the state yields have been far from spectacular. Drought conditions continue to get worse. There has been scattered rains around that are keeping some areas from totally burning up. Over 90 percent of the state is now showing on the latest drought monitor with only one county in the entire state not having any area listed. Although over all the market was lower this week there was still a few stick out sales which mostly occurred earlier in the week or on loads of heavier weights that were steady to even a bit higher than some of the top sales last week. Kingsville Livestock Market sold a load of 500 lb. steers at 304.00 as well as a load of 615 lb. steers tagged as fancy for 294.85. Callaway Livestock Center had a load of 709 lb. steers which sold for 255.00 and another load of 867 lb. steers for 230.50. Joplin Regional Stockyards had a consignment of 193 head of 909 lb. steers which sold for 228.00. Boxed beef cutouts continued the climb higher this week and closed very close to the record highs. Choice closed at 343.09, up 10.16 and select closed at 310.95, up 5.24 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report was only 48K head. Fed cattle prices were mostly lower this week. Live sales were reported from 182.00-190.00 and dressed sales from 296.00-300.00. 





### **Turkey Hatchery**

Eggs in Incubators on June 1 Up 7 Percent from Last Year. Turkey eggs in incubators on June 1, 2023 in the United States totaled 28.1 million, up 7 percent from June 1, 2022. Eggs in incubators were up 2 percent from the May 1, 2023 total of 27.6 million eggs.

Poults Hatched During May Up 4 Percent from Last Year Turkey poults hatched during May 2023 in the United States totaled 23.5 million, up 4 percent from May 2022. Poults hatched were up 11 percent from the April 2023 total of 21.1 million poults.

Net Poults Placed During May Up 4 Percent from Last Year The 22.4 million net poults placed during May 2023 in the United States were up

4 percent from the number placed during the same month a year earlier. Net poult placements were up 12 percent from the April 2023 total of 19.9 million

### **Broiler Hatchery**

Broiler-Type Eggs Set in the United States Up 1 Percent Hatcheries in the United States weekly program set 244 million eggs in incubators during the week ending June 10, 2023, up 1 percent from a year ago. Average hatchability for chicks hatched during the week in the United States was 79.4 percent. Average hatchability is calculated by dividing chicks hatched during the week by eggs set three-weeks earlier.

Broiler-Type Chicks Placed in the United States Down 1 Percent Broiler growers in the United States weekly program placed 189 million chicks for meat production during the week ending June 10, 2023, down 1 percent from a year ago. Cumulative placements from the week ending January 7, 2023 through June 10, 2023 for the United States were 4.30 billion. Cumulative placements were down slightly from the same period a year earlier.

Haying is in full swing now as farmers all across the state are trying to bale everything they can. Some areas are once again reporting army worm infestations. Hay interest and demand is good as many customers are trying to acquire hay in worry that supplies will get harder to come by if rains don't come. It should be noted there has been an uptick in cases of a few bad apples and attempted scams so all parties should be aware and if something seems fishy it probably is. The supply of hay is light and demand is moderate to good. Hay prices are steady to firm.
