



MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY


Compared to two weeks ago, steers and heifers steady to 5.00 higher, however there were some spots of weak to 3.00 lower depending on location and attractiveness of calves. The supply of cattle was moderate to heavy this week after most sale barns were closed the prior week for the holiday. Not only was there a week of closed sale barns, but dry conditions continue to take a toll and producers are bringing cattle to town that would otherwise still be at home. Demand was moderate to good with the market staying mostly firm, if the cattle are right. Some relief came late last week and over the weekend with rains hitting several areas of the state. The rains were needed, but more would be most welcome as pastures are getting thin, the corn crop is filling ears, and the soybean crop is starting to set pods. The most recent drought monitor for Missouri showed an expansion of D3 Extreme drought and parts of central Missouri are now classified D4 Exceptional Drought. Last week's Missouri Crop Progress categorized pasture condition as: 4 percent good, 25 percent fair, 41 percent poor, and 30 percent very poor. Supply of hay was rated: 23 percent adequate, 36 percent short, and 41 percent very short. There continues to be a steady demand of producers looking for hay, as hay fields have not yielded as much and they are worried about what the fall and winter will bring. Boxed beef choice cuts closed on Friday at 305.94, 10.96 lower than a week ago and Select closed at 276.61, 9.02 lower than a week ago. There were some negotiated cash sales with 35,663 head confirmed as of Friday's close, mostly from 183.00 to 186.00 for live, and dressed mostly at 290.00 to 291.00. Monday's Missouri Stocker Formula consists of 8534 head with a weighted average weight of 547.15 lbs and a price value of 274.15, 19.52 lower than a week ago, however the formula was influenced last week by special sales and few regular sales.



WORLD AG SUPPLY AND DEMAND ESTIMATES WHEAT: Changes this month to the 2023/24 U.S. wheat outlook

increase supplies and domestic use, leave exports unchanged, and increase ending stocks. Supplies are raised on larger production, which is up 74 million bushels to 1,739 million, on higher harvested area and yields. . Conversely, winter wheat production is forecast higher on larger harvested area and higher yields. Gains for all wheat production are partly offset by smaller beginning stocks, which are lowered 18 million bushels to 580 million as indicated in the Grain Stocks report, issued June 30. The 2023/24 ending stocks are forecast at 592 million bushels, 30 million higher than last month. The projected season-average farm price is forecast at \$7.50 per bushel, down \$0.20 from last month. **COARSE GRAINS:** This month's 2023/24 U.S. corn outlook is for

fractionally higher supplies and ending stocks. Corn beginning stocks are lowered 50 million bushels, as greater feed and residual use for 2022/23 more than offsets reductions in corn used for ethanol and exports. Corn production for 2023/24 is forecast up 55 million bushels as Selection 2-3 35-55 lbs 205.00-215.00. Slaughter nannies/does Selection 1 greater planted and harvested area from the June 30 Acreage report is partially offset by a 4.0-bushel reduction in yield to 177.5 bushels per acre. According to data from the National Centers for Environmental Information, harvested-area-weighted June precipitation data for the major Corn Belt states represented an extreme downward deviation from average. However, timely rainfall and cooler than normal temperatures for some of the driest parts of the Corn Belt during early July is expected to moderate the impact of June weather. With supply rising fractionally and use unchanged, ending stocks are up 5 million bushels. The season-average farm price received by producers is unchanged at \$4.80 per bushel.

OILSEEDS: U.S. oilseed production for 2023/24 is projected at 127.6 million tons, down 5.6 million from last month with reductions for soybeans and sunflowerseed, partly offset by higher canola and peanuts. Soybean production is projected at 4.3 billion bushels, down 210 million on lower harvested area. Harvested area, forecast at 83.5 million acres in the June 30 Acreage report, is down 4.0 million from last month. The soybean yield forecast is unchanged at 52.0 bushels per acre. With lower production partly offset by higher beginning stocks, 2023/24 soybean supplies are reduced 185 million bushels. Soybean crush is reduced 10 million bushels reflecting a lower soybean meal domestic disappearance forecast. Soybean exports are reduced 125 million bushels to 1.85 billion on lower U.S. supplies and lower global imports. With lower supplies only partly offset by reduced use, ending stocks for 2023/24 are projected at 300 million bushels, down 50 million from last month.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 07/13/23

The good news this week came in the form of rain. As the case has been all year not everyone received rain but there tended to be more that did than didn't this time. Some areas in south central reported areas of three to even five inches but most areas that got rain were in the inch to inch and a half. This week's drought monitor won't reflect any improvement from that which with only one rain would likely only be slight as it will take many events to make significant. The area of D# status grew to near 23 percent of the state with a section in central Missouri moving into D4 which is the exceptional drought and as bad as the categories get. Hay interest remains very high with producers trying to hold on to as much livestock as they can, although many have already culled herds deeply. Hay demand is good to very good. The supply is light.
