
## MISSOURI STEER (HEIFER) STOCKER FORMULA 08/21/2023

Monday's Missouri Stocker formula consists of **2898 (3677)** head with a weighted average weight of **548.11 (539.52)** lbs. and a price value of **286.19(255.42)**, 1.92 higher (0.80 lower) than last week.

This a rolling seven day calculated weighted value which combines all Feeder Steers reported by MDA/USDA Market News Service weighing from 400-649 lbs. in the Medium and Large 1 and Medium and Large 1-2 frame and muscle classifications, including all comment cattle except Brahman X. Heifer values are in parentheses.

## MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY

Compared to last week, steers sold steady to 3.00 higher, heifers under 750 lbs. uneven from 2.00 lower to 2.00 higher, heifers over 750 lbs. not well tested. Much like last week the supply was light to moderate with local sale volume typical of the season. Demand was moderate to good, buyers not as aggressive late week as heat has set in over the state and triple digits are expected for most of next week. Excessive heat makes moving cattle pretty stressful if not outright dangerous and with current price levels no one wants to risk any extra chances of loss. Still some impressive prices being paid for larger drafts of cattle that have all the bells, whistles and paperwork to prove it a legit health program. The monthly cattle on feed report came and will likely go next week without much notice. Placements were slightly below the average pre report estimate but still within the range of guesses. Recent moisture has really improved pasture conditions around the state and a few reports of hay equipment coming back out of storage as farmers were eager to add any hay they can make to hay plies. A few stick out sales this week included some part loads and full loads of 500-550 lb. steers at various auctions from the far south all the way north with top prices from 310.00-312.00. 81 head of 631 lb. steers at Callaway Livestock Center for 309.00. Lolli Brothers Livestock Market sold a load of 722 lb. steers at 287.00 and another load of 832 lb. steers at 261.00. Kingsville Livestock Market sold 3 loads of 968 lb. steers at 234.00. Boxed beef cutouts were sharply higher for the week. Choice closed at 316.11, up 13.50 and select closed at 288.36, up 11.13 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon right at 67K head reported. Live sales were reported from 177.00-188.00 and dressed sales were reported from 294.00-297.00 with most sales getting lower as the week progressed despite rising cutout values. Missouri Stocker formula consists of 2898 head with a weighted average weight of 548.11 lbs. and a price value of 286.19, 1.92 higher than a week ago. The steer/heifer spread is 30.77.




**August 2023 Soybean Bids**

### CATTLE ON FEED

United States Cattle on Feed Down 2 Percent

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.0 million head on August 1, 2023. The inventory was 2 percent below August 1, 2022.

Placements in feedlots during July totaled 1.62 million head, 8 percent below 2022. Net placements were 1.55 million head. During July, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 365,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 250,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 370,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 373,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 185,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 75,000 head.

Marketings of fed cattle during July totaled 1.73 million head, 5 percent below 2022.

Other disappearance totaled 65,000 head during July, 16 percent above 2022.

### PEANUT PRICES

Peanut prices received by farmers for all farmer stock peanuts averaged 25.4 cents per pound for the week ending August 12, down 2.4 cents from the previous week. Marketings of all farmer stock peanuts for the week ending August 12 totaled 32.6 million pounds, down 64.3 million pounds from the previous week.

Runner-type peanut prices averaged 22.7 cents per pound for the week ending August 12, down 5.1 cents from the previous week. Marketings of runner-type peanuts totaled 25.9 million pounds, down 71.0 million pounds from the previous week.

### MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 08/17/23

The drought monitor is finally catching up with rains over the last few weeks. Nearly 30 percent of the state is no longer in drought status. The worst areas continue to be the west central region of the state some extreme drought conditions persist. Grass has responded to the moisture much quicker than nearly anyone expected. Some hay equipment has been put back to work and some farmer's eagerly reporting grass is out pacing grazing which is nearly unheard of in August. The hay supply is light, demand is moderate. Hay prices are mostly steady however a slight bit of weakness was noted on some of the lower quality hay mostly in round bales as the extreme tops seen a month or so ago are no longer present.
