

#### MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY


Compared to last week, feeders sold 5.00 to 10.00 higher gaining back nearly all the losses seen last week after the negative monthly cattle on feed report. The supply of feeders was light to moderate and with the majority of the offering being calves under 600 lbs. a much more limited offering of heavy weights this week but those present were generally in full load lots and sold very well. Demand was moderate the hard first hard freeze of the year should reduce some of the risk of sickness for those short weaned and unvaccinated calves. Grain harvest in the state has been ahead of average pace all season and several farmers have wrapped up now which means barns could start to see some farmer feeders back in the seats looking for a winter project. A load of 822 lb. steers sold at Green City Livestock Market this week for 251.00, as well as another half load of 622 lb. steers which brought 284.50. One of the larger strings of cattle this week went through the ring at Ozarks Regional Stockyards a 228 head consignment of 937 lb. steers which sold for 226.50 another 81 head of 534 lb. steers sold at and even 300.00. 9 loads of 7 -800 lb. heifers sold at various actions this week from 240.75-251.00 including the largest string of the week at Windsor Livestock Auction which was 254 head of 737 lb. heifers that sold at 246.35. Boxed beef cutouts lost some ground this week. Choice closed at 302.34, down 4.63 and select closed at 272.01, down 8.11 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon totaled only 35K head as packers and feedlot managers were in a standoff. Live sales were reported mostly at 185.00 and dressed sales at 292.00. Nothing official until midday Monday but more trade occurred after hours on Friday and word is prices were steady with those earlier in the week. Missouri Stocker formula consists of 3966 head with a weighted average weight of 539.58 lbs. and a price value of 275.38, 10.31 higher than a week ago. The steer/heifer spread is 35.36.







**FATS AND OILS: OILSEED CRUSH, PROD, CONSUMPTION Soybeans crushed** for crude oil was 5.24 million tons (175 million bushels) in September 2023, compared with 5.07 million tons (169 million bushels) in August 2023 and 5.03 million tons (168 million bushels) in September 2022. Crude oil produced was 2.08 billion pounds, up 3 per-cent from August 2023 and up 4 percent from September 2022. Soybean once refined oil production at 1.73 billion pounds during September 2023 increased 1 percent from August 2023 and increased 4 percent from Sep-tember 2022 tember 2022

**Canola seeds crushed** for crude oil was 217,153 tons in September 2023, compared with 190,420 tons in August 2023 and 189,285 tons in September 2022. Canola crude oil produced was 170 million pounds, up 10 percent from August 2023 and up 15 percent from September 2022. Canola once refined oil production, at 148 million pounds during September 2023, was down 5 percent from August 2023 and down 6 percent from September 2022. September 2022

September 2022. **Cottonseed once refined** oil production, at 36.5 million pounds during September 2023, was up 24 percent from August 2023. **Edible tallow** production was 93.8 million pounds during September 2023, up 9 percent from August 2023 and up 4 percent from September 2022. Inedible tallow production was 297 million pounds during Septem-ber 2023, down 5 percent from August 2023 and down 16 percent from September 2022. Technical tallow production was 102 million pounds during September 2023, down 6 percent from August 2023 and down 1 percent from September 2022. Choice white grease production, at 99 million pounds during September 2023, decreased 21 percent from August 2023 and decreased 7 percent from September 2022. **GRAIN CRUSH AND CO-PRODUCTS Total corn consumed** for alcohol and other uses was 478 million bush-

Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 5.38 million bushels, up 9 percent from August 2023 and up 20 percent from September 2022. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 430 million bushels, was down 3 percent from August 2023 but up 12 percent from September 2022. Corn consumed in Septem-ber 2023 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 92.0 percent and 8.0 percent, respectively. **Dry mill co-product production** of distillers dried grains with solubles (DDGS) was 1.70 million tons during September 2022. Distillers wet grains (DWG) 65 percent or more moisture was 1.31 million tons in Sep-tember 2023. up 1 percent from August 2023 and up 5 percent from Sep-tember 2022. Wet mill congluten feed production was 246.782 tons during Sep-

Wet mill corn gluten feed production was 246,782 tons during September 2023, down 4 percent from August 2023 but up 3 percent from September 2022. Wet corn gluten feed 40 to 60 percent moisture was 196,264 tons in September 2023, down 5 percent from August 2023 but up 2 percent from September 2022.
