

MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY


Compared to last week feeders sold mostly steady to 5.00 lower with much of the decline on heavier weights. There were exceptions found on lighter weight calves under 550 lbs. if they were weaned, had shots, and a bit on the light side of flesh conditions. There are several orders out there for wheat grazers and many of those type of calves sold 10.00 higher. The supply was heavy with a couple of special sales this week as barns offer ample opportunities for marketing in the few full weeks left of this calendar year. Overall demand was moderate but varied depending on what was in the ring. Heavy weights saw the most pressure this week as nearby live cattle futures lost near 4.00 and feedlot trade also saw sharp losses this week. That being said there was some load lots of high-quality reputation yearlings which sold very near steady with last week. Unionville Livestock Market sold 7 loads of heavy 8 wt. steers from 226.75-230.75 and Joplin Regional Stockyards sold 682 head of 861 lb. steers in one draft for 227.50. A few of the light five weight steers still holding on to the 3.00 mark if they can be turned out for grazing 24 head of 535 lb. steers at Windsor Livestock Auction sold for 307.50. On the heifer side one stick out draft this week was two loads of 732 lb. heifers which sold for 224.75. Boxed beef cutouts continue to decline some of which is seasonal loss. On Friday choice closed at 288.01, down 9.45 and select closed at 257.90, down 7.59 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon came in just over 63K head. Live sales were reported from 169.00-171.00 and dressed sales at 267.00-271.00. Missouri Stocker formula consists of 9521 head with a weighted average weight of 557.11 lbs. and a price value of 252.30, 1.29 higher than a week ago. The steer/heifer spread is 29.52.







GRAIN CRUSHINGS AND CO-PRODUCTS

Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 511 million bushels in October 2023. Total corn consumption was up 7 percent from September 2023 and up 1 percent from October 2022. October 2023 usage included 92.5 percent for alcohol and 7.5 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 6.42 million bushels, up 19 percent from September 2023 and up 40 percent from October 2022. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 461 million bushels, was up 7 percent from September 2023 and up 3 percent from October 2022. Corn consumed in October 2023 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 92.0 percent and 8.0 percent, respec-

Dry mill co-product production of distillers dried grains with solubles (DDGS) was 1.80 million tons during October 2023, up 6 percent from September 2023 and up 3 percent from October 2022. Distillers wet grains (DWG) 65 percent or more moisture was 1.38 million tons in October 2023, up 5 percent from September 2023 but down 1 percent from October 2022.

Wet mill corn gluten feed production was 265,908 tons during October 2023, up 8 percent from September 2023 but down 1 percent from October 2022. Wet corn gluten feed 40 to 60 percent moisture was 212,424 tons in October 2023, up 8 percent from September 2023 and up 2 percent from October 2022.

OILSEED CRUSHINGS, PROD, CONSUMPTION, STOCKS

Soybeans crushed for crude oil was 6.04 million tons (201 million bushels) in October 2023, compared with 5.24 million tons (175 million bushels) in September 2023 and 5.90 million tons (197 million bushels) in October 2022. Crude oil produced was 2.38 billion pounds up 14 percent from September 2023 and up 2 percent from October 2022. Soybean once refined oil production at 1.89 billion pounds during October 2023 increased 9 percent from September 2023 and increased 5 percent from October 2022.

Canola seeds crushed for crude oil was 208,071 tons in October 2023, compared with 217,153 tons in September 2023 and 208,459 tons in October 2022. Canola crude oil produced was 165 million pounds, down 3 percent from September 2023 and down 3 percent from October 2022. Canola once refined oil production, at 174 million pounds during October 2023, was up 18 percent from September 2023 and up 8 percent from October 2022.

Cottonseed once refined oil production, at 35.0 million pounds during October 2023, was down 4 percent from September 2023 and down 12 percent from October 2022.

Edible tallow production was 76.0 million pounds during October 2023, down 19 percent from September 2023 and down 6 percent from October 2022. Inedible tallow production was 318 million pounds during October 2023, up 9 percent from September 2023 but down 15 percent from October 2022. Technical tallow production was 109 million pounds during October 2023, up 10 percent from September 2023 but down 4 percent from October 2022. Choice white grease production, at 105 million pounds during October 2023, increased 4 percent from September 2023 but decreased 3 percent from October 2022.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 12/07/23

Despite several areas of the state getting light precipitation since last weekend, over 92 percent of the state is included on the drought monitor. Weather conditions have been warmer than what we usually see in December, but some frost has been seen in the morning before warming in the afternoons. A majority of cattle producers are feeding hay at this point. Hay movement and demand remain moderate, the supply of hay is light to moderate, and prices mostly steady.
