

MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY

Total Receipts: 49,899 Week Ago: 44,855 Year Ago: 39,924 Compared to last week, feeders sold 2.00 to 8.00 higher. Another big run at the barns this week with heavy supplies at nearly every auction. Joplin Regional Stockyards broke their one-day all-time record volume again after doing so just a couple of weeks ago and sold 15,769 head though the barn in one day. Demand remains good to very good as buyers continue to pay more each week for cattle. Grass fever is in full swing as the first signs of spring seems to be arriving early. Tree frogs can be heard peeping their songs, daffodils are blooming around old farmhouses and some of last year's crop fields are getting a slight tint of purple from henbit just starting to bloom. Friday's cattle on feed report was viewed as somewhat bearish and could cause a minor hick up as the week starts but overall, the story of supplies hasn't changed despite large numbers coming to the market in a short amount of time. Marketings and On Feed number were nearly even with year ago as expected. January placements were expected to be much lower than a year ago with the average estimate at 88 percent. This was due to extremely limited movement in January due to holidays and winter weather. There was one week in Missouri were nearly every auction was canceled. When the report was released however Placements were tagged at 93 percent which was the top end of pre report estimates. This left many of the industry analysis scratching their heads over the weekend. Some of this week's stick out sales included 21 head of 375 lb. steers at Joplin Regional Stockyards that sold for 405.00. Kingsville Livestock Market sold a load of 528 lb. steers at 350.00 and another load of 805 lb. steers at 248.00. Unionville Livestock Market had a load of 912 lb. steers which sold for 241.75. Callaway Livestock Center sold 99 head of 552 lb. heifers for 301.25. Boxed beef cutouts values were mixed this week. Choice closed on Friday at 300.61, up 4.41 and select closed at 286.31, down 0.35 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled 42K head with sales developing late and more likely took place after the report cutoff. Live sales were reported at 182.00-184.00 and Dressed sales at 292.00. The Missouri Stocker Formula is at a record high as of this report. Missouri Stocker formula consists of 8,219 head with a weighted average weight of 550.14 lbs. and a price value of 302.11, 5.01 higher than a week ago. The steer/ heifer spread is 34.82.



CATTLE ON FEED

Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.8 million head on February 1, 2024. The inventory was slightly above

Placements in feedlots during January totaled 1.79 million head, 7 percent below 2023. Net placements were 1.71 million head. During January, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 370,000 head, 600-699 pounds were 395,000 head, 700-799 pounds were 475,000 head, 800-899 pounds were 377,000 head, 900-999 pounds were 105,000 head, and 1,000 pounds and greater were 70.000 head.

Marketings of fed cattle during January totaled 1.84 million head, slightly below 2023.

Other disappearance totaled 81,000 head during January, 29 percent above 2023

LIVESTOCK SLAUGHTER

Commercial red meat production for the United States totaled 4.77 billion pounds in January, up slightly from the 4.76 billion pounds produced in January 2023.

Beef production, at 2.28 billion pounds, was 2 percent below the previous year. Cattle slaughter totaled 2.73 million head, down 3 percent from January 2023. The average live weight was up 9 pounds from the previous year, at 1,389 pounds.

Veal production totaled 3.9 million pounds, 12 percent below January a year ago. Calf slaughter totaled 22,600 head, 26 percent below January 2023. The average live weight was up 45 pounds from last year, at 294 pounds.

Pork production totaled 2.47 billion pounds, 2 percent above the previous year. Hog slaughter totaled 11.4 million head, 2 percent above January 2023. The average live weight was down 1 pound from the previous year, at 292 pounds.

Lamb and mutton production, at 10.6 million pounds, was 4 percent above January 2023. Sheep slaughter totaled 171,700 head, 5 percent above last year. The average live weight was 121 pounds, down 2 pounds from January a year ago.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 02/22/24

Spring was in the air this week. Although grass turn out is still a ways away there are some early sprigs of grass showing up especially in the southern part of the state. Warmer weather has some people looking to unload some extra hay now and the average to lower quality hay has backed off from the higher prices seen earlier in the feeding season. Given the high cost of hay and the general lower supplies most farmers are glad for what appears to be an early spring. The supply of hay is light to moderate, demand is moderate, and prices for high quality hay steady to firm mid to lower quality hay steady to weak.
