


Compared to last week, feeders sold unevenly steady to 3.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate with a good selection across all weight groups once again this week. Demand was good with a few reporters making note that in some cases if quality was present buyers were starting to overlook a lack of weaning on the calves. Ample moisture has fallen across most of the state now and farmers are indeed thankful but would like to have some sun and be able to get back to work now. A few notable sales this week included a 26 head of part load of 434 lb. steers at Kingsville Livestock Auction which sold for 372.50. Windsor Livestock Auction sold 39 head of 509 lb. steers at 351.00. F &T Livestock Market sold 20 head of 604 lb. steers at 319.50. Joplin Regional Stockyards had 31 head of 719 lb. steers at 273.00 as well as two loads of 824 lbs. steers which sold for 251.50. Kingsville Livestock Auction 13 loads of 700-750 lb. heifers from 250.25-252.50. New Cambria Livestock Market had a load of 700 lb. heifers which sold for 256.00. Boxed beef cutouts values slightly lower for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 394.20, down 2.94 and select closed at 287.65, down 1.07 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled about 71K head, live sales were reported from 184.00-187.00 and dressed sales from 294.00-295.00. 





MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

There were 3.6 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending April 28, 2024. Statewide, the average temperature was 58.3 degrees, 0.3 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 3.21 inches, 2.25 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 5 percent short, 71 percent adequate, and 23 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent very short, 19 percent short, 68 percent adequate, and 9 percent surplus. Corn planted reached 63 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 40 percent. Corn emerged reached 35 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 10 percent. Soybeans planted reached 24 percent, compared to the 5-ware surged reached 50 percent. year average of 9 percent. Soybeans emerged reached 9 percent, com-pared to the 5-year average of 2 percent. Cotton planted reached 10 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 3 percent. Cotton emerged reached 1 percent. Rice planted reached 68 percent, compared to the 5 -year average of 37 percent. Rice emerged reached 24 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 16 percent. Winter wheat headed reached 51 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 17 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 1 percent poor, 20 percent fair, 69 percent good, and 9 percent excellent.

OILSEED CRUSHINGS, PROD, CONSUMPTION, STOCKS Soybeans crushed for crude oil was 6.11 million tons (204 million bushels) in March 2024, compared with 5.82 million tons (194 mil-lion bushels) in February 2024 and 5.94 million tons (198 million bushels) in March 2023. Crude oil produced was 2.41 billion pounds, up 5 percent from February 2024 and up 3 percent from March 2023. Soybean once refined oil production at 1.79 billion pounds during March 2024 increased 10 percent from February 2024 but decreased 1 percent from March 2023.

GRAIN CRUSHINGS AND CO-PRODUCTS PRODUCTION Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 522 million bushels in March 2024. Total corn consumption was up 5 percent from February 2024 and up 7 percent from March 2023. March 2024 usage included 92.3 percent for alcohol and 7.7 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 4.30 million bushels, down 5 percent from February 2024 and down 25 percent from March 2023. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 469 million bushels, was up 5 percent from February 2024 and up 7 percent from March 2023. Corn consumed in March 2024 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 92.2 percent and 7.8 percent, respectively

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 05/02/24

Moisture brought field work to a halt this week. Rainfall amounts varied widely from an inch to in excess of ten inches since the last report. Many fields had water running through them or standing over them for at least some amount of time. Haying and planting were put on hold and likely some spots at least could require some replanting. Pasture conditions are fair to mostly good and stock water supplies are adequate as most ponds are now full or nearly so. The supply of hay is light to mod-erate, demand moderate and prices are mostly steady.
