

MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY

Total Receipts: 29,107 Week Ago: 33,232 Year Ago: 42,201 Compared to last week, feeders under 650 lbs. sold very uneven but mostly 2.00 lower to 2.00 higher, with instances around the state from sharply higher to sharply lower. Feeders over 650 lbs. sold steady to 2.00 lower. The supply of feeders was moderate the amount of heavier weight cattle was not as plentiful this week and for the first time in several months the percentage of steers vs. heifers was closer in line with traditional expectations with about a 60:40 split. For the last several months it has been running a lot closer to 50:50. With only one week of such data reflecting this is it would be extremely presumptuous to assume there has been any shift in the cattle cycle yet. Demand was good. A few notable sales this week included a 44 head of 447 lb. steers at Windsor Livestock Auction which sold for 399.00. South Central Regional Stockyards had several stick out sales this week as they had a loaded list of consignments with quality running deep into the offering. 38 head of 528 lbs. steers sold for 356.00, 36 head of 720 lb. steers brought 270.25 and another 46 head of 804 lbs. steers sold for 254.75. Mo-Kan Livestock Market sold a load of 601 lb. steers for 319.00. Callaway Livestock Center sold a load of 929 lbs. steers for 230.25 as well as 29 head of 512 lb. heifers for 313.50. Kingsville Livestock Market had a load of 744 lb. heifers which sold for 255.00. Choice closed on Friday at 294.57, up 0.37 and select closed at 284.17, down 3.48 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled about 61K head with more sales likely taking place after the reporting deadline, live sales were reported from 184.00-187.00 and dressed sales from 295.00-296.00. Missouri Stocker formula consists of 6,535 head with a weighted average weight of 543.51 lbs. and a price value of 316.81, 1.91 lower than a week ago. The steer/heifer spread is 37.00.



In Nebraska, compared to last week, live FOB purchases traded steady to 1.00 lower from 186.00- 187.00, and dressed delivered purchases traded 1.00 higher from 295.00-296.00. In the Western Cornbelt, compared to the last reported market on Thursday, live FOB purchases traded mostly 0.50 higher at 187.00, with a few up to 188.00, and dressed delivered purchases traded steady at 295.00, with a few up to 296.00.







MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

There were 1.9 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending May 5, 2024. Statewide, the average temperature was 65.4 degrees, 6.3 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 1.84 inches, 0.78 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 3 percent short, 61 percent adequate, and 35 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 9 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 16 percent surplus. Corn planted reached 67 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 55 percent. Corn emerged reached 48 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 24 percent. Soybeans planted reached 30 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 16 percent. Soybeans emerged reached 17 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 5 percent. Cotton planted reached 34 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 15 percent. Cotton emerged reached 7 percent. Rice planted reached 77 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 52 percent. Rice emerged reached 41 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 30 percent. Winter wheat headed reached 76 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 34 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 2 percent poor, 16 percent fair, 73 percent good, and 9 percent excellent.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 05/09/24

Field work continues to be on hold as fields are currently too wet to get in. Some severe weather passed over the state again this week causing some damage in areas. The drought monitor has shown significant improvement with the moisture from the last few weeks, with only 30 percent of the state showing in the latest monitor. This has helped to brighten the moods going into hay season and as typical seasonal lack of demand has put some pressure on the hay market, although most hay piles and barns are near empty until producers can get into fields. The supply of hay is light to moderate, demand light and prices are steady to weak.
