

Compared to the last tested markets which was generally two weeks ago, feeders sold unevenly steady, with spots from 5.00 lower to 5.00 higher. As summer draws nearer the hotter weather is making buyers less eager to own calves that are still bawling or carrying extra hair. More attractive lots weaned with shots along with heavier weight load lots continue to push to higher prices. Many farmers are now trying to work around rains and get hay baled it has been a slow start for some, but progress is running ahead of the five-year average, and no one is even remotely willing to utter a bad word about the moisture. A few notable sales this week included a small draft of 509 lb. steers at Tina Livestock Market which sold for 367.00. A load of 603 lb. steers at Interstate Regional Stockyards brought 314.50. Lolli Brothers Livestock Market sold a full load of 715 lb. steers for 290.10. Green City Livestock Market sold a load of 878 lb. steers for 259.00. On the heifer side of the market Kingsville Livestock Market sold a part load of 730 lb. heifers at 264.00. Farmington Regional Stockyards had a gooseneck load of 516 lb. heifers which sold for 331.00. Boxed beef cutouts were mixed for the week, choice closed on Friday at 316.75, up 3.55 and select closed at 301.14, down 0.57 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled only 247K head trade was still taking place into the afternoon and likely the evening. As of the report deadline live sales were reported 185.00-190.00, a light test of dressed sales reported from 298.00-301.00. MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

There were 4.4 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending June 2, 2024. Statewide, the average temperature was 69.1 degrees, 1.2 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 1.19 inches, 0.28 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 2 percent short, 80 percent adequate, and 18 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 5 percent short, 84 percent adequate, and 11 percent surplus. Corn planted reached 93 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 90 percent. Corn emerged reached 81 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 82 percent. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 24 percent fair, 56 percent good, and 10 percent excellent. Soybeans planted reached 68 percent, compared to the 5year average of 55 percent. Soybeans emerged reached 52 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 41 percent. Soybean condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 32 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 4 percent excellent. Rice condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 18 percent fair, 68 percent good, and 5 percent excellent. Winter wheat harvested for grain reached 5 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 1 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 27 percent fair, 59 percent good, and 9 percent excellent.
