


Compared to last week, feeder steers and heifers sold steady to 5.00 higher, with some spots of 5.00-10.00 higher. The supply of feeders was moderate with a better test of the market than last week. Although there were no real heavy volume sales, for midsummer the offering was pretty respectable. Several reporters noted that quality was much improved over the last few weeks with several load lots of feeders that found good demand from buyers. Grass remains extremely green for the end of July in Missouri so no one is really selling due to lack of grass. The ample pasture has also provided the option to restock some pastures for those who have already marketed some claves that were placed in early spring. A few stick out sales this week included a couple of lots at Callaway Livestock Center where 45 head of 622 lb. steers sold at 325.50 and then 2 loads of 734 lb. steers for 298.28. Unionville Livestock Market sold 5 loads of steers that were heavy eight weights and sold from 266.75-270.50. Kingsville Livestock Auction sold two loads of light seven weight heifers at 268.25 and 269.50. Lolli Brothers Livestock Market sold 23 head of 3 year old 2<sup>nd</sup> calf heifers for 3650.00 per head. Boxed beef cutouts were mixed for the week, choice closed on Friday at 313.77, up 0.28 and select closed at 297.46, down 1.34 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled 52K head. Live sales were reported 190.00-198.00 and dressed sales reported mostly at 312.00. The Missouri Stocker formula consists of 3758 head with a weighted average weight of 553.50 lbs. and a price value of 314.81, 7.18 higher than a week ago. The steer/heifer spread is 30.74.







### MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

There were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending July 21, 2024. Statewide, the average temperature was 74.1 degrees, 4.5 degrees below normal. Precipitation averaged 0.89 inches, 0.10 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 5 percent short, 87 percent adequate, and 8 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent short, 90 percent adequate, and 6 percent surplus. Corn silking reached 87 percent, compared to the 5-year average 76 percent. Corn dough reached 51 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 24 percent. Corn condition was rated 4 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 14 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 21 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming reached 57 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 45 percent. Soybeans setting pods reached 26 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 16 percent. Soybean condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 4 percent poor, 15 percent fair, 65 percent good, and 14 percent excellent. Cotton squaring reached 83 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 77 percent. Cotton setting bolls reached 18 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 28 percent. Cotton condition was rated 3 percent very poor, 8 percent poor, 28 percent fair, and 61 percent good. Rice headed reached 23 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 20 percent. Rice condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 7 percent poor, 15 percent fair, 74 percent good, and 2 percent excellent.

### MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY

Several producers around the state, especially in the south, are currently dealing with an infestation of army worms. Although they appear every year it is speculated that moths blew up with hurricane winds a few weeks ago and has led to a larger than normal infestation this year. There is still a fair amount of haying taking place and producers have been able to rebuild inventories. This as resulted in a very slow market as there is not currently much buyer demand. Hay prices are weak, the supply of hay is moderate, and demand is light.
