


Compared to last week, steers steady to 5.00 higher, spots up to 10.00 higher. Heifers steady to 5.00 higher. Buyers continue to want good long weaned cattle with shots and giving unweaned, unvaccinated calves discounts. A typical October price spread continues to be seen, with cold weather not too far away. Hay supply is not a major concern for many around the state, but in the backs of minds as fall is here. Demand was good on a moderate supply. There were 79,790 head of negotiated cash trade. Live FOB purchases were mostly 186.00 to 188.00. Dressed delivered 296.00 to 297.00. Boxed beef cuts closed on Friday at 311.22 and 288.72 for Choice and Select, respectively. This was an 8.64 gain for Choice and a 1.11 gain for Select. The Missouri Stocker Formula consists of 3600 head with a weighted average weight of 544.90 lbs. and a price value of 289.93, 10.27 higher than a week ago. The steer/heifer spread is 27.47.







MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

There were 6.5 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending October 6, 2024. Statewide, the average temperature was 67.2 degrees, 6.0 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 0.11 inches, 0.69 inches below normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 6 percent very short, 33 percent short, and 61 percent adequate. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 6 percent very short, 31 percent short, and 63 percent adequate. Corn mature reached 97 percent, compared to the 5year average of 90 percent. Corn harvested for grain reached 62 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 45 percent. Soybeans dropping leaves reached 84 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 68 percent. Soybeans harvested reached 23 percent, compared to the 5year average of 14 percent. Soybean condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 5 percent poor, 21 percent fair, 60 percent good, and 12 percent excellent. Cotton bolls opening reached 93 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 89 percent. Cotton harvested reached 20 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 11 percent. Cotton condition was rated 3 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 28 percent fair, and 63 percent good. Rice harvested reached 82 percent, compared to the 5year average of 70 percent. Winter wheat planted reached 10 percent, equal to the 5-year average. Winter wheat emerged reached 2 percent, also equal to the 5-year average.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY

Cooler temperatures in the past several mornings show a hint of fall before warming to the eighties in the afternoons. Some cooler weather is expected for next week, however. Monday's Missouri crop progress report showed 62 percent of corn and 23 percent of soybeans have been harvested, but a lot of progress has been made this week. Clear skies and warm afternoons mean combines haven't slowed down much. Some late season hay is still being baled and there are a few reports of corn stalks being baled behind combines, even though we are in a much better hay stocks situation than where we were a year ago. Monday's report showed the supply of hay and roughages as: 15 percent surplus, 81 percent adequate, and 4 percent short. Compared to a year ago with hay supply at 29 percent adequate, 31 percent short, and 40 percent very short. Hay prices are steady to weak. The supply of hay is moderate to heavy, and demand is light.
