



This a rolling seven day calculated weighted value which combines all Feeder Steers reported by MDA/USDA Market News Service weighing from 400-649 lbs. in the Medium and Large 1 and Medium and Large 1-2 frame and muscle classifications, including all comment cattle except Brahman X. MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY Total Receipts: 52,105 Week Ago: 38,810 Year Ago: 52,173

Compared to last week, feeder steers and heifers sold mostly 5.00 higher with some calves having spots up to 10.00 higher. This was the largest volume week of the year so far. Weather was more cooperative early week which allowed for some very large auctions, by late week a little rain around and temperatures rising above freezing made for some pretty sloppy mud returning. Friday saw the much-anticipated yearly cattle inventory report released. Nationwide the cattle heard shrink by 1% marketing the lowest inventory in 64 years. Aside from the total number another area of interest was the number of beef heifers over 500 lbs. This number is considered a good reflection of the direction of the herd and although pre report industry estimates expected this number would be higher it was officially reported at 2.3 percent below the average guess at 99% of last year which tends to reflect that the industry is still not seeing any expansion. The total calf crop was reported even with last year which points to cows in the herd being held longer for another calf or two and that is also supported by the lower cow slaughter over the last year. Missouri held its rank as the third largest for beef cows, at 1.864 million head, which was a slight increase over last year as producers seemed to slow down on culling this past year. A few stick out sales this week included the first sale of any 3 wts. to hit the \$5.00 per pound mark. A very small package of 5 head weighting 349 lbs. sold for 500.00 even at Joplin Regional Stockyards. They also passed the \$4.00 per pound mark on 5 wts. with 19 head of 503 lb. steers at 403.00. Tina Livestock Auction sold 52 head of 609 lb. steers for 339.75. Kingsville Livestock Auction sold 42 head of 702 lb. steers for 310.50 and 168 head of 799 lb. steers at 282.00. Callaway Livestock Center sold 63 head of 829 lb. steers at 279.75 as well as 38 head of 509 lb. heifers for 351.00. Windsor Livestock Auction sold 67 head of 768 lb. heifers for 277.25. Boxed beef cutouts were mixed for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 327.68, down 0.24 and Select closed at 317.07, up 0.78 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled only 43K head as of the 2:00 report cutoff time. The gap in prices between the south and north narrowed as the south played catch up last week. Live sales in the south jumped to 208.00-209.00 the north was reported mostly at 210.00. Dressed sales were reported at mostly 330.00. Trade volume in the north was light and as of this report it is unknown if there was more trade late Friday or if this will just be recorded as a light week. There is some talk of packers cutting kill hours which could lead to a bit less demand for numbers. 




HEIFERS: Medium and Large 1







CATTLE INVENTORY
All cattle and calves in the United States as of January 1, 2025 totaled 86.7 million head, 1 percent below the 87.2 million head on January 1, 2024. All cows and heifers that have calved, at 37.2 million head, were slightly below the 37.4 million head on January 1, 2024. Beef cows, at 27.9 million head, were down 1 percent from a year ago. Milk cover at 9.35 million head, were up a lightly from the province of All cows, at 9.35 million head, were up slightly from the previous year. All heifers 500 pounds and over as of January 1, 2025 totaled 18.2 million head, 1 percent below the 18.3 million head on January 1, 2024. Beef replacement heifers, at 4.67 million head, were down 1 percent from a year ago. Milk replacement heifers, at 3.91 million head, were down 1 percent from the previous year. Other heifers, at 9.59 million head, were 1 percent below a year earlier. Steers weighing 500 pounds and over as of January 1, 2025 totaled 15.8 million head, down 1 percent from January 1, 2024. Bulls weighing 500 pounds and over as of January 1, 2025 totaled 2.01 million head, down 1 percent from January 1, 2024. Calves under 500 pounds as of January 1, 2025 totaled 13.5 million head, down slightly from January 1, 2024. Cattle and calves on feed for the slaughter market in the United States for all feedlots totaled 14.3 million head on January 1, 2025. The inventory is down 1 percent from the January 1, 2024 total of 14.4 million head. Cattle on feed in feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head accounted for 82.7 percent of the total cattle on feed on January 1, 2025, up slightly from the previous year. The combined total of calves under 500 pounds and other heifers and steers over 500 pounds (outside of feedlots), at 24.6 million head, was slightly below January 1, 2024. The 2024 calf crop in the United States was estimated at 33.5 million head, down slightly from the previous year's calf crop. Calves born during the first half of 2024 were estimated at 24.6 million head, down slightly from the first half of 2023. Calves born during the second half of 2024 were estimated. ed at 8.93 million head, 27 percent of the total 2024 calf crop

SHEEP AND GOAT INVENTORY

All sheep and lambs inventory in the United States on January 1, 2025 totaled 5.05 million head, up slightly from 2024. Breeding sheep 2025 totaled 5.05 million head, up slightly from 2024. Breeding sheep inventory at 3.68 million head on January 1, 2025, increased slightly from 3.67 million head on January 1, 2024. Ewes one year old and older, at 2.88 million head, were slightly above last year. Market sheep and lambs on January 1, 2025 totaled 1.37 million head, up 1 percent from January 1, 2024. Market lambs comprised 94 percent of the total market inventory. Market sheep comprised the remaining 6 percent of total market inventory. The 2024 lamb crop of 3.04 million head was up slightly from 2023. The 2024 lambing rate was 106 lambs per 100 ewes one year old and older on January 1, 2024, up 3 percent from 2023. Shorn wool production in the United States during 2024 was 22.5 million pounds, down 1 percent from 2023. Sheep and lambs shorn million pounds, down 1 percent from 2023. Sheep and lambs shorn totaled 3.17 million head, down 2 percent from 2023. The average price paid for wool sold in 2024 was \$1.43 per pound for a total value of 32.1 million dollars, down 9 percent from 35.4 million dollars in 2023. As of January 1, 2025, 27 percent of the total sheep and lambs were hair sheep or wool hair crosses. **Sheep death loss** during 2024 totaled 200,000 head, unchanged from 2023. Lamb death loss increased 1 percent from 365,000 head to 370,000 head in 2024. All goats and kids inventory in the United States on January 1, 2025 totaled 2.51 million head, up 1 percent from 2024. Breeding goat inventory totaled 2.07 million head, up 1 percent from 2024. Does one year old and older, at 1.54 million head, were 2 percent above last year's number. Market goats and kids totaled 442,000 head, up 2 percent from a year ago. Kid crop for 2024 totaled 1.52 million head for all goats, down 1 percent from 2023. Meat and all other goats totaled 1.98 million head on January 1, 2025, up 1 percent from 2024. Milk goat inventory was 430,000 head, up 4 percent from January 1, 2024, while angora goats were down 3 percent, totaling 102,000 head. Mohair production in the United States during 2024 was 500,000 pounds. Goats and kids clipped totaled 92,000 head. Average weight per clip was 5.4 pounds.

The state woke up to rain on Thursday morning. Unlike last week however, the mercury is well above freezing. There is some concern with flooding in the south central and southeast parts of the state as heavy rains are predicted. There continues to be an ample supply of hay available for anyone looking to buy. Although there is still a while before grass the arrival of February will make folks start to think of grass and spring fertilizer even though more winter is very likely. Hay prices are unevenly steady to weak. The supply of hay is moderate to heavy, and demand is light to moderate.
