

MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY Total Receipts: 34,424 Week Ago: 32,613 Year Ago: 29,662

Compared to last week, feeders sold mostly steady. Locally spots of both higher and lower markets could be found but when all was said and done most price averages were pretty close to the previous week. Several reporters did note that quality wasn't as attractive this week and many of the extreme tops were absent. Extremely heavy rains and severe weather resulted in a lot of water and flooding in the south central and southeast portions of the state. Other areas may have been spared from the excessive rains but still got enough to make standing water common in many fields. Global trade uncertainty mid-week caused for some major losses in livestock and soybean futures. There was at least a noteworthy uptick in demand for replacement stock this week. Several packages of high-quality open feeder heifers returned to the farm as well as several bred cows and pairs finding a bit more interest. Some stick out feeder sales around the state included 22 head of 512 lb. steers at Joplin Regional Stockyards that sold for 400.00. Tina Livestock Market sold 35 head of 606 lb. steers for 353.00. Green City Livestock Auction sold 47 head of 745 lb. steers for 319.00 and 70 head of 802 lb. steers for 302.00. Unionville Livestock Market sold 62 head of 846 lbs. steers for 292.60. Kingsville Livestock Auction that sold for 488.00. On the heifer side of the market 25 head of 539 lb. heifers at Green City Livestock Auction sold for 364.00. Kingsville Livestock Auction sold 70 head of 715 lb. heifers for 294.00. Boxed beef cutouts were mixed this week. Choice closed on Friday at 338.45, up 5.63 and Select closed at 317.18, down 1.50 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the Friday afternoon report totaled just over 67K head as of the 2:00 report cutoff time. As futures markets dropped lower mid-week feedlot trade also began a bit sooner this week with some light sales Wednesday and then more occurring on Thursday the bulk of the sales however still occurred on Friday. Prices were steady to slightly lower this week. Live and dressed sales ranged from 208.00-213.00 and dressed sales were reported from mostly at 335.00. The Missouri Stocker formula consists of 5179 head with a weighted average weight of 524.48 lbs. and a price value of 373.27, 1.55 higher than last week setting an all-time record high once again. The steer/heifer spread is 43.67 per cwt.






HEIFERS: Medium and Large 1







PROSPECTIVE PLANTINGS

Corn planted area for all purposes in 2025 is estimated at 95.3 million acres, up 5 percent or 4.73 million acres from last year. Compared with last year, planted acreage is expected to be up or unchanged in 40 of the 48 estimating States.

Soybean planted area for 2025 is estimated at 83.5 million acres, down 4 percent from last year. Compared with last year, planted acreage is

down or unchanged in 23 of the 29 estimating States.

All wheat planted area for 2025 is estimated at 45.4 million acres, down 2 percent from 2024. If realized, this represents the second lowest all wheat planted area since records began in 1919. The 2025 winter wheat planted area, at 33.3 million acres, is down 2 percent from the previous estimate and down less than 1 percent from last year. Of this total, about 23.6 million acres are Hard Red Winter, 6.09 million acres are Soft Red Winter, and 3.66 million acres are White Winter. Area expected to be planted to other spring wheat for 2025 is estimated at 10.0 million acres, down 6 percent from 2024 estimate. Of this total, about 9.40 million acres are Hard Red Spring wheat. Durum planted area for 2025 is expected to total 2.02 million acres, down 2 percent from the previous year.

All cotton planted area for 2025 is estimated at 9.87 million acres, down 12 percent from last year. Upland area is estimated at 9.71 million acres, down 12 percent from 2024. American Pima area is estimated at 157,000 acres, down 24 percent from 2024.

GRAIN STOCKS

Corn stocks in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 8.15 billion bushels, down 2 percent from March 1, 2024. Of the total stocks, 4.50 billion bushels were stored on farms, down 11 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, at 3.65 billion bushels, are up 12 percent from a year ago. The December 2024 - February 2025 indicated disappearance is 3.92 billion bushels, compared with 3.82 billion bushels during the same period last year.

Soybeans stored in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 1.91 billion bushels, up 4 percent from March 1, 2024. Soybean stocks stored on farms are estimated at 877 million bushels, down 6 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 1.03 billion bushels, are up 13 percent from last March. Indicated disappearance for the December 2024 - February 2025 quarter totaled 1.19 billion bushels, up 3 percent from the same

period a year earlier.

All wheat stored in all positions on March 1, 2025 totaled 1.24 billion bushels, up 14 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks are estimated at 307 million bushels, up 13 percent from last March. Off-farm stocks, at 930 million bushels, are up 14 percent from a year ago. The December 2024 - February 2025 indicated disappearance is 336 million bushels, 1 percent above the same period a year earlier.

GRAIN CRUSH AND CO-PRODUCTS PRODUCTION

Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 465 million bushels in February 2025. Total corn consumption was down 10 percent from January 2025 and down 6 percent from February 2024. February 2025 usage included 92.6 percent for alcohol and 7.4 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 3.04 million bushels, up 7 percent from January 2025 but down 33 percent from February 2024. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 421 million bushels, was down 10 percent from January 2025 and down 5 percent from February 2024. Corn consumed in February 2025 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 91.9 percent and 8.1 percent, respectively

OILSEED CRUSH, PROD, CONSUMPTION, AND STOCKS
Soybeans crushed for crude oil was 5.67 million tons (189 million bushels) in February 2025, compared with 6.38 million tons (213 million tons) (213 million tons) (213 million tons) (213 million tons) lion bushels) in January 2025 and 5.80 million tons (193 million bushels) in February 2024. Crude oil produced was 2.24 billion pounds, down 11 percent from January 2025 and down 2 percent from February 2024. Soybean once refined oil production at 1.61 billion pounds during February 2025 decreased 6 percent from January 2025 and decreased 1 percent from February 2024.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 4/3/2025

Severe weather and heavy rains over several days prevented any field work from taking place this week. Priorities shifted as many were dealing with flooding along with wind and even some tornado damage. Hay prices continue to hold mostly steady even as feeding days are quickly winding down and turn out is beginning in some areas. Hay demand is light and the supply of hay is moderate.
