
MISSOURI STEER (HEIFER) STOCKER FORMULA 5/5/2025

Monday's Missouri Stocker formula consists of **8456 (7614)** head with a weighted average weight of **534.60 (528.26)** lbs. and a price value of **387.36 (343.10)**, 12.86 higher (2.48 higher) than a week ago. This a rolling seven day calculated weighted value which combines all Feeder Steers reported by MDA/USDA Market News Service weighing from 400-649 lbs. in the Medium and Large 1 and Medium and Large 1-2 frame and muscle classifications, including all comment cattle except Brahman X. Heifer values are in parentheses.


Compared to the light test from last week, feeder steers and heifers sold 10.00 to 15.00 higher. The feeder supply was moderate. Although several loads of yearling steers and 7wt. heifers sold at various auctions, the majority of the offering was calves under 600 lbs. Also of note was that 47% of the total feeder offering was heifers. Markets once again spiked higher with many never-before-seen prices flashing across the sold boards at the auction barns. Demand for all classes of cattle is good to very good. Many areas of the state continue to be pretty wet and field work either planting or hay wrapping has been limited. Pastures are in good condition but about everything would benefit from a little more sunshine and some warmer days. With the markets in record territory once again nearly every sale is impressive but a couple of notables this week was that the weighted average price statewide for 500-550 lb. M&L 1 steers was over 400.00 per cwt and 700-750 lb. M&L 1 heifers was over 300.00 per cwt. Stick out sales were abundant making it hard to figure out just was a highlight among an entire week of highlights. Joplin Regional Stockyards sold 55 head of 503 lb. steers for 426.00, as well as 32 head of 706 lb. steers for 344.00. Ozarks Regional Stockyards sold 28 head of 653 lb. steers for 351.00. Unionville Livestock Market sold 2 loads of steers 857 and 866 lbs. both for 330.00. Multiple barns sold loads of 700-750 lb. heifers this week from 310.00-317.00 with Kingsville Livestock Auction selling 148 head of 703 lbs. heifers which sold for 320.00. Boxed beef cutouts were higher for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 342.90, up 6.42 and Select closed at 325.35, up 5.24 compared to last Friday. Negotiated feedlot sales developed with the bulk of the trade reported on Wednesday with a few more sales on both Thursday and Friday, pushing volume to the largest since at least last fall. As of the 2:00 cutoff time for Friday afternoons report nearly 96K head was reported for the week. Live prices were 4.00 to 5.00 higher and dressed sales were 7.00-10.00 higher. Live sales were reported mostly at 218.00 in the south and 222.00 in the north, dressed sales were reported mostly at 350.00. The Missouri Stocker formula consists of 8456 head with a weighted average weight of 534.60 lbs. and a price value of 387.36, 12.86 higher than last week and once again a new record high. The steer/heifer spread is 44.26 per cwt.





MONTHLY GRAIN CROP


April 2025 Soybean Bids

MISSOURI CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION 4/28/25

There were 2.9 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending April 27, 2025. Statewide, the average temperature was 62.5 degrees, 4.0 degrees above normal. Precipitation averaged 1.42 inches, 0.42 inches above normal. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 23 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 1 percent very short, 6 percent short, 82 percent adequate, and 11 percent surplus. Corn planted reached 47 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 41 percent. Corn emerged reached 15 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 14 percent. Soybeans planted reached 25 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 12 percent. Soybeans emerged reached 4 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 3 percent. Cotton planted reached 5 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 3 percent. Rice planted reached 44 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 42 percent. Rice emerged reached 11 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 16 percent. Winter wheat headed reached 26 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 22 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 3 percent poor, 22 percent fair, 61 percent good, and 14 percent excellent.

GRAIN CRUSHINGS AND CO-PRODUCTS PRODUCTION

March 2025 contained 31 days. Total corn consumed for alcohol and other uses was 504 million bushels in March 2025. Total corn consumption was up 8 percent from February 2025 but down 4 percent from March 2024. March 2025 usage included 92.2 percent for alcohol and 7.8 percent for other purposes. Corn consumed for beverage alcohol totaled 4.21 million bushels, up 39 percent from February 2025 but down 2 percent from March 2024. Corn for fuel alcohol, at 454 million bushels, was up 8 percent from February 2025 but down 4 percent from March 2024. Corn consumed in March 2025 for dry milling fuel production and wet milling fuel production was 91.6 percent and 8.4 percent, respectively.

OILSEED CRUSH, PROD, CONSUMPTION, STOCKS

Soybeans crushed for crude oil was 6.20 million tons (207 million bushels) in March 2025, compared with 5.69 million tons (190 million bushels) in February 2025 and 6.11 million tons (204 million bushels) in March 2024. Crude oil produced was 2.47 billion pounds, up 10 percent from February 2025 and up 3 percent from March 2024. Soybean once refined oil production at 1.88 billion pounds during March 2025 increased 16 percent from February 2025 and increased 5 percent from March 2024.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 5/1/2025

Another pretty wet week has prevented much field work in the state for all but just a few areas. There was a bit of high moisture hay cut and wrapped last week but that too has been very limited. Several would like to get started but there hasn't even been enough dry days in most areas to accomplish that. Pastures and hay fields do look good with all the moisture but at this point some warm sunshine is needed. Hay prices are steady to weak, supply and demand are light to moderate.
