



Total Receipts: 41,012 Week Ago: 24,144 Year Ago: 53,185
 Compared to last week, feeders sold 5.00-30.00 higher, with some lighter weight calves suitable for wheat grazing 30.00 to as much as 50.00 higher, with prices gaining ground nearly every day. An unbelievable turn around in the markets and attitudes following the Thanksgiving holiday. Colder weather has no doubt helped health issues somewhat but really nothing substantial to provide any one reason for the turn around. Supplies as everyone knows remain tight and market opportunities for buying and selling are ticking away for this calendar year. Nearly every barn is holding a replacement cow special this month with many this coming week. A few that have taken place already had provided some jaw dropping prices. Stick out sales this week included several drafts from the Special Pre-vac sale head at Joplin Regional Stockyards, which not only benefited from being late in the week but also from a large offering of cattle with verified health and weaning programs. That being said all barns are once again finding prices worth bragging about. A few of the Stick out sales at Joplin included 35 head of 557 lb. steers that sold for 450.00, 90 head of 608 lb. steers for 440.00, 23 head of 675 lb. steers for 402.50, 40 head of 752 lb. steers for 370.00, and 54 head of 909 lb. steers for 325.00. New Cambria Livestock Auction sold 25 head of 480 lb. steers for 509.00 and 23 head of 504 lb. steers for 488.00. Ozarks Regional Stockyards sold 27 head of 715 lb. steers for 375.00. MO-Kan Livestock Market sold 119 head of 842 lb. steers for 345.50. On the heifer side of the market Wheeler Livestock Auction sold 25 head of 506 lb. heifers for 440.00. Windsor Livestock Auction sold 151 head of 729 lb. heifers for 359.00. Boxed beef cutout values closed lower for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 361.20, down 5.62 and select closed at 347.39, down 3.66 compared to last week. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the 2:00 cutoff time on Friday afternoons report came in just under 63K head. Prices were sharply higher with nearly all the trade reported in the north. Texas had not reported anything due to confidentiality reasons and Kansas hadn't traded anything as of the 2:00 cut off time for the report. lower for the week. Live sales in the north reported at 220.00-225.00 and dressed sales 340.00-345.00. 



MONTHLY GRAIN CROP


December 2025 Soybean Bids

There were 6.7 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending Nov 23, 2025. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 7 percent very short, 29 percent short, 60 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 13 percent very short, 34 percent short, 51 percent adequate, and 2 percent surplus. Corn Harvest is at 96 percent complete, compared to the 5 year average of 97 percent. Winter wheat planted is at 91 percent which compares to the 5 year average of 95 percent. Winter wheat emerged is at 69 percent, compared to the 5 year average of 84 percent. Winter wheat condition was rated 0 percent very poor, 3 percent poor, 39 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 3 percent excellent.

LIVESTOCK SLAUGHTER

Commercial Red Meat Production Down 3 Percent from Last Year

October 2024 contained 23 weekdays (including 1 holiday) and 4 Saturdays. **October 2025** contained 23 weekdays (including 1 holiday) and 4 Saturdays.

Commercial red meat production for the United States totaled 4.89 billion pounds in October, down 3 percent from the 5.02 billion pounds produced in October 2024.

Beef production, at 2.33 billion pounds, was 6 percent below the previous year. Cattle slaughter totaled 2.63 million head, down 8 percent from October 2024. The average live weight was up 30 pounds from the previous year, at 1,448 pounds. **Veal production** totaled 2.0 million pounds, 39 percent below October a year ago. Calf slaughter totaled 9,600 head, down 44 percent from October 2024. The average live weight was up 29 pounds from last year, at 358 pounds.

Pork production totaled 2.55 billion pounds, up slightly from the previous year. Hog slaughter totaled 11.8 million head, down 1 percent from October 2024. The average live weight was up 3 pounds from the previous year, at 290 pounds.

Lamb and mutton production, at 10.7 million pounds, was down 8 percent from October 2024. Sheep slaughter totaled 193,500 head, 1 percent below last year. The average live weight was 109 pounds, down 9 pounds from October a year ago.

January to October 2025 commercial red meat production was 44.6 billion pounds, down 3 percent from 2024. Accumulated beef production was down 4 percent from last year, veal was down 38 percent, pork was down 1 percent from last year, and lamb and mutton production was up 1 percent.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 12/04/2025

The first winter weather of the year arrived across the state this past week. Some areas in the north received over 10 inches of snow. This along with much cooler temperatures had everyone out feeding. As always, the first snow provided a slight boost to hay movement and demand. The supply of hay is moderate to heavy and at this time there isn't any concerns with feed availability. There has been some slight improvement in the drought monitor but over 3% of the state is still listed in some stage of drought. Even though the growing season is over winter moisture is needed before spring arrives. Prices are mostly steady.
