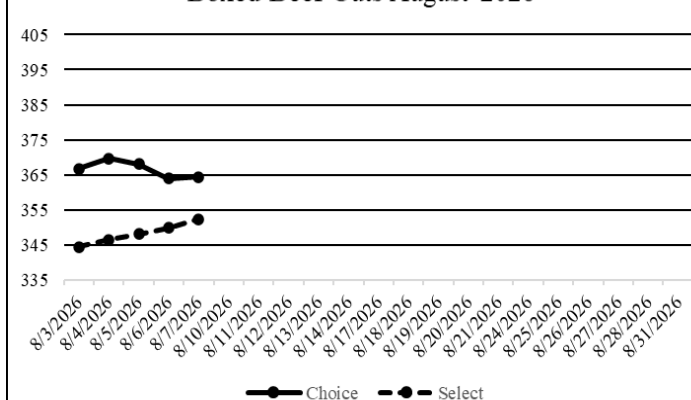

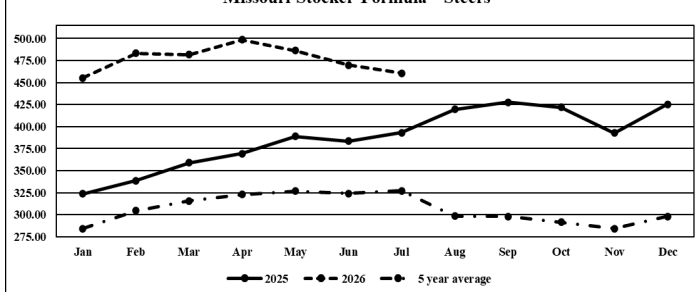

MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY

Total Receipts: 18,880 Week Ago: 7,141 Year Ago: 26,376

Compared to last week, feeders sold 10.00 to 20.00 higher. Supply was light to moderate, but cooler weather for the first half of the week allowed some producers to feel better about moving a few cattle. Demand is good, although buyers are selective and discounts are being applied to the lighter weight calves without shots, weaning, or excessive hair, that come with a bit more risk. The cattle complex showed a bit of life again this week as most sectors of the market showed gains this week. A few replacement sales were noted to have very good demand with large crowds on hand and some very impressive prices for quality take home stock. Once again stick-out sales on drafts over 20 head mainly was heavier weight cattle. Joplin Regional Stockyards sold 31 head of 508 lb. steers for 480.00 and 62 head of 804 lb. steers for 362.00. Interstate Regional Stockyards sold 31 head of 608 lb. steers for 430.00. Windsor Livestock Auction sold 59 head of 690 lb. steers for 402.00. Callaway Livestock Center sold 68 head of 721 lb. steers for 388.00 Four State Stockyards sold 23 head of 766 lb. steers for 364.50. Green City Livestock Market sold 60 head of 893 lb. steers for 352.25, 61 head of 907 lb. steers for 351.00 and 66 head of 955 lb. steers for 337.75. Callaway Livestock Center sold 36 head of 525 lb. heifers for 455.00 Windsor Livestock Auction sold 73 head of 704 lb. heifers for 375.00. Boxed beef cut-out values closed the week higher. Choice closed at 364.36, up 2.98 and Select closed at 352.37, up 6.14 compared to last week. The choice/select spread is 11.99 per cwt. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the 2:00 cutoff time on Friday were reported near 102K head, the second largest week of the year so far. Prices were higher this week. Live sales reported mostly at 235.00 and dressed sales mostly 370.00. The Missouri Stocker formula consists of 2334 head with a weighted average weight of 550.29 lbs. and a price value of 437.02, 3.98 higher than last week. The steer/heifer is 38.16 per cwt.

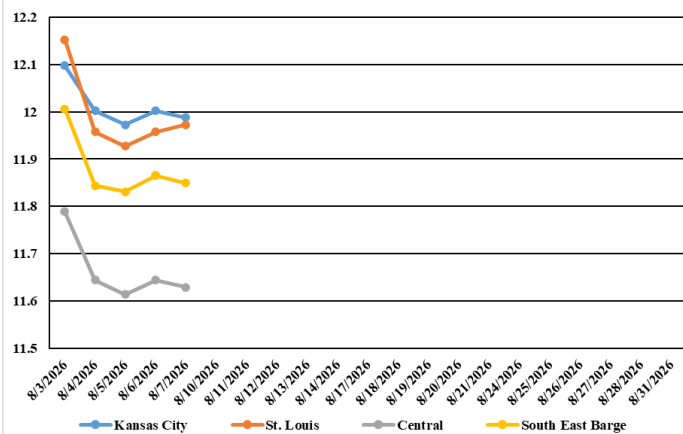

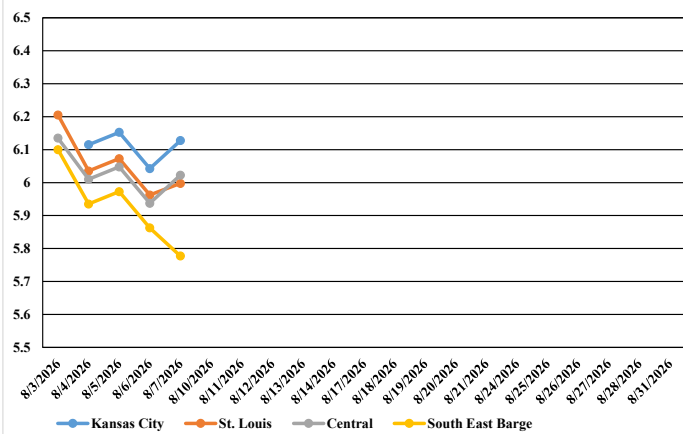

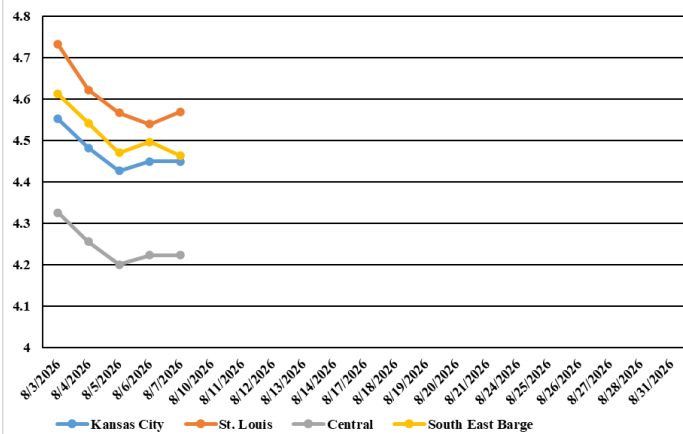

CROP PROGRESS

There were 5.7 days suitable for fieldwork in the week ending Aug 2, 2026. Topsoil moisture supply was rated 4 percent very short, 17 percent short, 74 percent adequate, and 5 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supply was rated 3 percent very short, 14 percent short, 79 percent adequate, and 4 percent surplus. Pasture and Range Condition was rated at 0 percent very poor, 3 percent poor, 17 percent fair, 70 percent good and 10 percent Excellent. Corn silking was at 95 percent, 1 percent ahead of the 5-yr average. Corn in the dough stage was at 64 percent, compared to the 5-yr average of 62 percent. Corn dented was at 15 percent, compared to the 5-year average of 6 percent. Corn condition was rated 2 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 26 percent fair, 55 percent good, and 11 percent excellent. Soybeans blooming was at 82 percent, 9 percent ahead of the 5 year average. Soybeans setting pods at 51 percent, compared to the 5-yr average of 43 percent at this time. Soybean conditions rated at 1 percent very poor, 6 percent poor, 29 percent fair, 57 percent good, and 7 percent excellent. Hay cutting excluding alfalfa was at 94 percent complete, even with the 5-year average. Second cutting of Alfalfa was at 83 percent complete compared to the 5-year average of 91 percent. Third cutting of Alfalfa was at 25 percent complete, 4 percent behind the 5-year average.

Hay harvest has been moving along as producers have had to play catch up most of the season following a late start due to weather delays. Overall progress is back on track and some producers starting to put equipment away now. Pastures across the state are currently rated as some of the best in the nation for the week ending Aug 2nd, 80 percent of the state was rated good to excellent, 17 percent fair, and 3 percent poor. A big jump in highlighted areas of the state showing on the drought monitor this week. Much of the north has received recent rains that may not be reflected yet. There are areas in the southern part of the state that have sure missed out lately though. Lots of hay showing up for sale and supplies are moderate to heavy. Hay prices are steady on grass types of hay and firm to higher on the upper end of Alfalfa. Hay demand is light.
