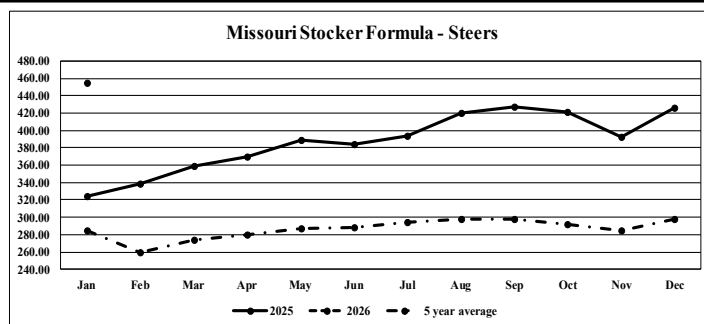

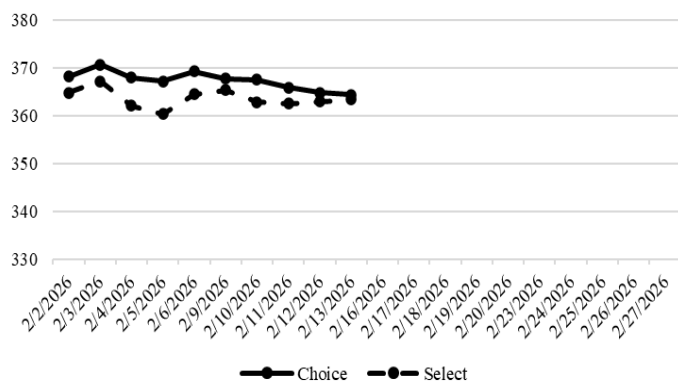

MISSOURI WEEKLY CATTLE AUCTION SUMMARY

Total Receipts: 50,759 Week Ago: 34,274 Year Ago: 23,671

Compared to last week, feeders sold steady to 5.00 higher, still some spots of sharply higher money on the right kind and quality, especially on mid to lighter weights suitable for grazing. Though the market seemed to be a bit calmer this week. Overall quality was perhaps not quite as impressive as what has been in previous weeks as many of the best feeders have already been marketed. Not to say there still wasn't some impressive drafts and following the recent cold and snow flesh conditions generally favored the buyers a bit more. The supply was heavy as those who were unable to get out because of weather were able to market cattle this week. Record high temperatures even resulted in a little mud on top even though most of the state remains in some stage of drought. A few stick out sales this week of drafts over 20 head included: 57 head of 466 lb. steers at Joplin Regional Stockyards that brought 600.00 and 114 head of 865 lb. steers for 366.00. Kingsville Livestock Auction sold 39 head of 522 lb. steers for 550.00 and 67 head of 568 lb. steers for 515.00. Windsor Livestock Auction sold 27 head of 633 lb. steers for 485.00 and a load of 757 lb. steers for 400.00. Callaway Livestock Center sold 23 head of 681 lb. steers for 449.00 and 27 head of 718 lb. steers for 421.00. South Central Regional Stockyards sold 32 head of 807 lb. steers for 382.00. Unionville Livestock Market sold a load of 905 lb. steers for 364.00. Callaway Livestock Center sold 48 head of 508 lb. heifers for 500.00. and Kingsville Livestock Auction sold 24 head of 708 lb. heifers heading to feed for 374.00. Several more of the heavier weight heifers this week had interest as replacements although total numbers of heavier weight heifers were not as large as last week. Boxed beef cutout values closed lower for the week. Choice closed on Friday at 364.47, down 4.86 and select closed at 363.42, down 1.11 compared to last week. The choice/select spread remaining narrow at 1.05 per cwt. Negotiated feedlot sales as of the 2:00 cutoff time on Friday afternoons report was very limited and came in just under 13k head. There was no doubt significant volume that occurred later Friday after the report cut off time. The limited sales that were reported were steady to higher, live prices were reported 238.00-248.00. Dressed sales reported 378.00-382.00. Missouri Stocker formula consists of 9171 head with a weighted average weight of 548.82 lbs. and a price value of 482.79, 2.76 higher than last week. The steer/heifer spread is 50.31.

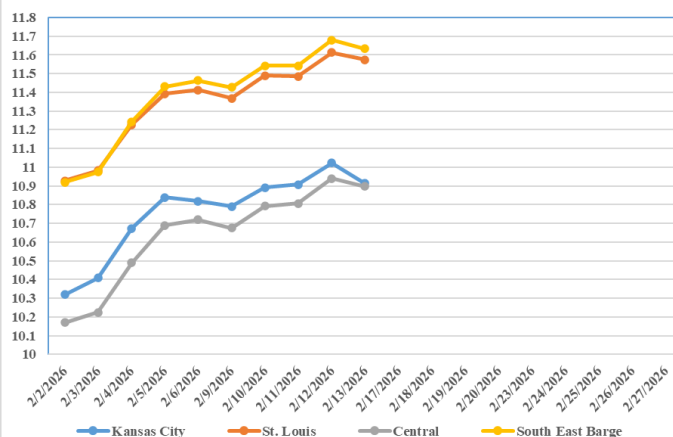

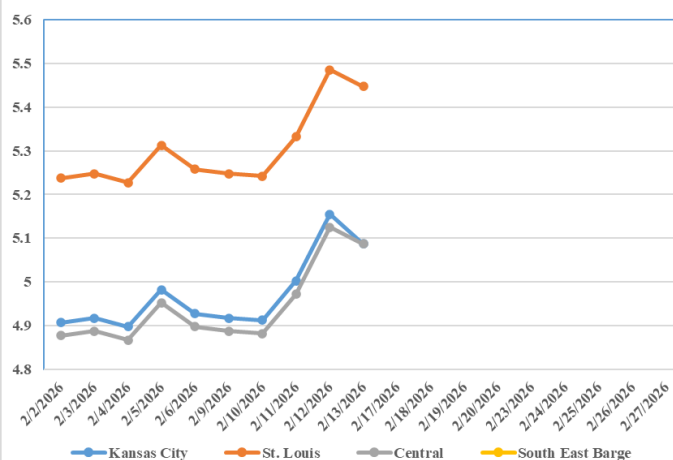

MONTHLY GRAIN CROP

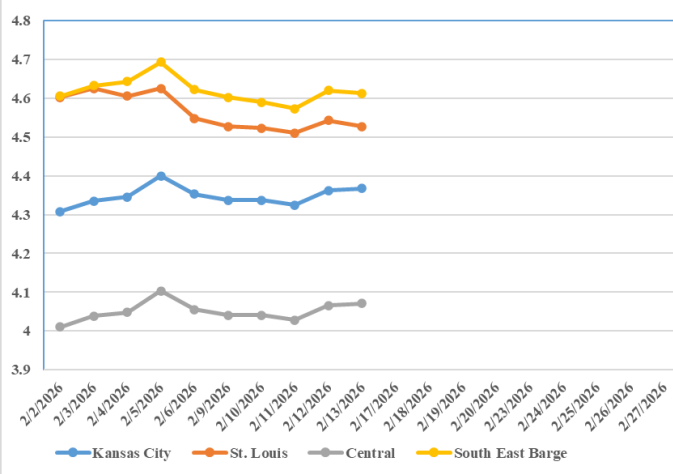
February 2026 Soybean Bids

FARM AND LAND IN FARMS 2025 SUMMARY

Farms and Land in Farms Highlights

The number of farms in the United States for 2025 is estimated at 1,865,000, down 15,000 farms from 2024. The number of farms decreased in all sales classes except the \$1,000,000 or more sales class. In 2025, 48.0 percent of all farms had less than \$10,000 in sales and 78.8 percent of all farms had less than \$100,000 in sales. In 2025, 9.9 percent of all farms had sales of \$500,000 or more.

Total land in farms, at 873,950,000 acres, decreased 2,510,000 acres from 2024. The land in farms decreased in all sales classes except the \$1,000,000 or more sales class which increased by 850,000 acres. In 2025, 25.7 percent of all farmland was operated by farms with less than \$100,000 in sales, while 50.1 percent of all farmland was operated by farms with sales of \$500,000 or more.

The average farm size for 2025 is 469 acres, up from 466 acres the previous year

CAPACITY OF REFRIGERATED WAREHOUSES

Refrigerated Warehouses Capacity 3.99 Billion Cubic Feet

Gross refrigerated storage capacity in the United States totaled 3.99 billion cubic feet on October 1, 2025. This was the 54th biennial survey of refrigerated warehouses. The five States with the largest gross warehouse capacity (million cubic feet) were: California 400, Georgia 304, Washington 301, Wisconsin 297, and Texas 254.

Usable refrigerated storage capacity was 3.25 billion cubic feet, or 82 percent of the gross space. Usable freezer space was 79 percent of the usable refrigerated space with the remaining 21 percent used as cooler space.

Public warehouse refrigerated storage capacity totaled 2.46 billion gross cubic feet in 2025, accounting for 62 percent of the total storage.

Private and semiprivate warehouse refrigerated capacity totaled 1.53 billion gross cubic feet, or 38 percent of the gross refrigerated space.

Refrigerated warehouse numbers totaled 931 in 2025. The number of public warehouses is 476. Private and semiprivate warehouses totaled 455.

MISSOURI WEEKLY HAY SUMMARY 2/06/2026

As predicted snow and cold did take over the state a couple of weeks ago, luckily for most of MO there wasn't as much snow as had been forecast. A warmup this past week has most of that snow gone now. It very dry snow without much moisture content and really did nothing to change the drought monitor. Far SW and SC are now seeing some areas in D3 status. Feeding season is likely around the mid-point now and supplies are still plentiful, although much of the round bales being feed to cattle do need some additional supplementation this year as quality did not meet quantity. Hay demand is light to moderate and being out weighted by the current supply. Prices are mostly steady.
