Subject: Summer Gasoline Vapor Pressure Position Statement
Date: April 29, 2025

On April 28, 2025, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued an emergency fuel waiver for the 2025 summer driving season. This waiver allows a one pound per square inch (1.0 psi) vapor pressure tolerance for gasoline and gasoline-ethanol blends containing ten percent (10%) ethanol and fifteen percent (15%) ethanol for most states, including Missouri. The Missouri Department of Agriculture regulations have incorporated, by reference, ASTM specification D4814-24a for gasoline and gasoline-ethanol blends in 2 CSR 90-30.040 and follows EPA vapor pressure control regulations for the period of May 1 through September 15 each year. As a result of EPA's announcement regarding vapor pressure tolerance waivers during this time period, the Department will be enforcing the tolerances as waived for gasoline and gasoline-oxygenate blends from May 1 through September 15 until such waiver is revised, modified, or terminated.

Details of EPA regulations and test methods are available in Part 1090 of Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations (40 CFR Part 1090).
